

Martin Luther King Jr. (born **Michael King Jr.**, January 15, 1929 – April 4, 1968) was an American Baptist minister and activist who was a leader in the Civil Rights Movement. He is best known for his role in the advancement of civil rights using nonviolent civil disobedience based on his Christian beliefs.

Abraham Lincoln (February 12, 1809 – April 15, 1865) was an American politician and lawyer who served as the 16th President of the United States from March 1861 until his assassination in April of 1865. Lincoln led the United States through its Civil War—its bloodiest war and perhaps its greatest moral, constitutional, and political crisis. In doing so, he preserved the Union abolished slavery, strengthened the federal government, and modernized the economy.

The holiday's roots are in the ancient Roman festival of Lupercalia, a celebration commemorated annually on February 15. Pope Gelasius I recast this pagan festival as a Christian feast **day** circa 496, declaring February 14 to be **St. Valentine's Day**.
