<b>Definition</b>	Diverse needs of students are addressed in the inclusive classroom.	Additional support beyond what the classroom teacher provides.	Further assistance is designed for specific needs based upon criteria of acceptance into a support program. The process may involve legal requirements.	Higher level assistance that may involve specialized assessment and/or compliance with equity and other legal requirements.	Intensive multi-agency supports are required to meet the needs of the student and family. The plan integrates the resources of the DOE and other agencies. Student placement may be in an off-campus therapeutic and/or educational setting.
