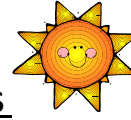


SOLEADO STUDENT COUNCIL PROCEDURES

Thursday, September 29: Speeches will be approved in the Science Room at recess time.

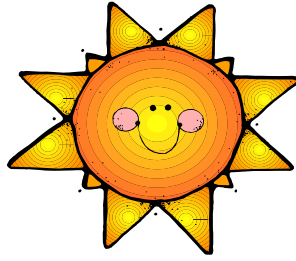
Friday, September 30: Approved speeches will be given after the Friday FLAG CEREMONY.

RULES FOR RUNNING FOR OFFICE

1. Candidates must be good citizens and must be caught up in all their work. Each candidate must have a signed petition from their homeroom teacher stating approval.
2. One poster for each candidate may be posted in designated area 2 days before the election assembly.
3. Candidates may not distribute paraphernalia, treats, bribes, or other items as campaigning assistants.
4. Other students may not be used as campaign helpers.
5. Speeches should be **no more than 2 minutes in length, approved by teacher or principal and memorized**; however note cards are acceptable.
6. Radios and other sound system devices may not be used during speech presentations.
7. Candidates should influence others by speaking about their strengths, experience, ideas, and goals. No promises are to be given that are unrealistic and out of your control as a student leader.
