JOB TITLE: Attendance Secretary

DESCRIPTION OF BASIC RESPONSIBILITIES

To perform a variety of responsible clerical support activities in the maintenance of student attendance accounting.

SUPERVISOR: Site Administrator

TYPICAL DUTIES:

- 1. Performs a variety of clerical activities primarily related to student attendance.
- 2. Contacts teachers/parents by telephone to verify absences and early dismissals to update emergency cards and to obtain other necessary information.
- 3. Checks, verifies, sorts, tabulates, and files a variety of data and information according to alphabetical, numerical, index, and/or cross-reference files.
- 4. Maintains and processes information related to assigned operational records by transferring data, calculating totals and subtotals, or compiling summaries.
- 5. Maintains computerized data files and records relating to student attendance, records entering/withdrawing students, records/updates emergency information.
- 6. Processes forms, applications, and/or other paperwork for school office and programs.
- 7. Publishes and distributes daily student absence list.
- 8. Assists parents, guardians, students and staff in all areas of attendance including tardies, appointments, truancies, transfers, independent student contracts, homework requests, absence verification, and student registration.
- 9. Processes and maintains computer attendance files and related matters.
- 10. Generates monthly and yearly attendance reports and submits to the District Office.
- 11. Generates yearly attendance summary of each student for placement in cumulative folders.
- 12. Maintains daily student count by homeroom and grade level.
- 13. Types prescribed information on forms, cards and records from clearly defined sources.
- 14. Prepares memos, correspondence, and/or reports from clear draft, handwritten copy, notes, or verbal direction.
- 15. Answers telephones, takes messages and/or refers callers to appropriate sources/staff.
- 16. Receives visitors in school office, provides information, or directs to appropriate office/staff.
- 17. Assists ill/injured students and administers basic First Aid and medication in accordance with established District policy, guidelines and District training.
- 18. May assign and review the work of student assistants.
- 19. Supervises students waiting in the school office.
- 20. Monitors and responds to District communication system.
- 21. Performs other duties similar to the above in scope and function as required.

EMPLOYMENT STANDARDS:

Knowledge of:

- 1. District policies and procedures affecting student attendance.
- 2. Modern office methods, procedures and practices.
- Recordkeeping systems and files.
- 4. Proper English usage, grammar, punctuation and spelling.

Ability to:

- 1. Word process accurately at a rate required for successful job performance.
- 2. Learn the operations, procedures, policies, and requirements of assigned responsibilities.
- 3. Work with minimal supervision.
- 4. Operate standard office equipment/machines such as calculator, copy machine, PC.
- 5. Establish and maintain routine records and reports.
- 6. Perform routine mathematical calculations.
- 7. Meet and maintain physical requirements necessary to perform assigned job functions in a safe and effective manner.
- 8. Communicate effectively in oral and written form.
- 9. Establish and maintain effective work relationships with those contacted in the performance of required duties.

EDUCATION, EXPERIENCE AND REQUIREMENTS:

- 1. High School diploma or equivalent
- 2. TB Test clearance
- 3. Drug test clearance
- 4. Criminal Justice Fingerprint clearance
- 5. First Aid Certificate or completion of District sponsored First Aid training.

PHYSICAL CHARACTERISTICS:

- 1. Sufficient vision to read printed material;
- 2. Sufficient hearing to conduct in-person and telephone conversations;
- 3. Understandable voice with sufficient volume and clarity to be heard in normal conversations:
- Sufficient dexterity to write, use telephone and office equipment;
- 5. Sufficient strength to lift, carry, reach and handle objects;
- 6. Physical, mental and emotional stamina to endure long hours under sometimes stressful conditions.
