Homebound (Hospitalized) Instructional Program

Re: Homebound Instruction

Dear Health Care Provider,

Summit Academy's Homebound Instruction Program is designed to meet the basic academic needs of students who are unable to attend school due to medical or emotional reasons. Students being taught in the Homebound Instruction Program may only have contact with a teacher once a week for two hours. Due to the limited course structure of the program, upper level math, science, and honors classes are not available. Because of these limitations, please consider carefully the recommendation you make concerning the referral of your patient to Homebound Instruction as an alternative to regular school attendance.

If the student is diagnosed as having an emotional disorder (i.e. depression, anxiety, school phobia, et.), please specifically list the factors that would interfere with the student's ability to function in a school setting.

If, after due consideration, you feel that Summit Academy's Homebound Instructional Program is appropriate for your patient, please complete the attached statement of needs and return it to Summit Academy.
