

ACT Reading Test Tips

What will the ACT Reading Test look like?

4 sections: 1 long or 2 shorter passages in each section. 10 questions for each section (**40 questions total**). **35 minutes**. The passages are always in this order:

1. Prose Fiction (excerpt from a novel, short story, memoir, personal essay)
2. Social Studies (topics can include psychology, history, geography, political science, etc.)
3. Humanities (various topics about the arts)
4. Natural Sciences (topics can include biology, chemistry, physics, technology, etc.)

TIP: Answer the passages in the order that play to your strengths.

PACING

You only have **8 minutes** for each of the 4 sections.

Don't read the instructions! Read instructions **BEFORE** test day! (see back side)

Types of Questions:



1. Identify & interpret details
2. Main idea
3. Comparisons & Contrasts
4. Cause-Effect
5. Make generalizations
6. Sequences of events
7. Author's voice & method
8. Determine meaning of words from context

READING STRATEGY

Step 1: Scan ?s & look for keywords. Circle them.

Step 2: Scan passage looking for these keywords & circle.

Step 3: Summarize each paragraph with annotation in margin (3-5 words).

Step 4: Work detail/fact ?s first, and then other ? types.



Composite FYI

- * 22 composite: answer 26 ?s correctly.
- * 26 composite: answer 31 ?s correctly.
- * 30 + answer 35-40 ?s correctly.
- * Difficult ?s worth same as easy ones. Answer easy ones for more points – GUESS on tough ones. No penalty for wrong answers!

Instructions for the Reading Test

There's no reason to waste a single minute (or even a fraction of one) glancing at the instructions during the test. Do yourself a favor and learn them before test day. NOTE: If section contains 2 passages, then some questions will be about Passage A, Passage B, and then both passages.

DIRECTIONS: There are several passages in this test. Each passage is accompanied by several questions. After reading a passage, choose the best answer to each question and fill in the corresponding oval on your answer document. You may refer to the passages as often as necessary.
