- ❖ Adrian Perez reported the trip to the State Capitol was a success. He actually got to be on the House Floor. The kids really were impressed with it all. He thanked Mr. Kirby and Dr. Lopez for making it happen. Mr. Perez also thanked Washington & Mendota Elementary schools for successful carnivals. He was part of the Senior Interview Panel and he was impressed with the process. He also announced that Danny Trejo was named Fresno Bee's "Player of the Year". Mr. Perez requested a moment of silence for Mrs. Alfing, a former longtime teacher of Mendota Unified. He also informed on the MESA club, they took 1st place at MESA Regional UC Santa Cruz. They could possibly make it all the way to Philadelphia if they win at UC Irvine.
- ❖ Alma Durazo stated that she too was part of the Senior Interviews and they were "Awesome". She noted how well the students were dressed, how well prepared their portfolios were, hopefully they can use them for real job interviews.
- ❖ Diana Toscano commented that she approved of the Senior Interviews and that the interviews actually helped her daughter prepare herself. She acknowledged Mr. Ochoa and how successful the Migrant Mini Conference was, noting that parents looked happy.
- ❖ Raul Varela commended Robert Gonzales and his crew for their work. He also questioned Robert Gonzales regarding an accident with one of the busses and a visitor's vehicle. Robert explained that the visitor clipped the bus while making a U-turn. Raul suggested making/marking an area to keep visitor and bus parking separate to avoid future incidents. Robert said he would look in to it and report back to the board.
- ❖ Lupe Flores informed those in attendance she enjoyed the carnival at Mendota Elementary. She is volunteering next year. Face painting was very popular. Lupe enjoyed the open space Mendota Elem had to offer as well as the outdoor stage. She is also looking forward to the Cinco de Mayo activities at McCabe/Washington next week. Lupe also thanked Sergio Valdez and his wife for taking care of our facilities by not letting anyone use the keys except themselves or designated personnel. Dr. Lopez mentioned that they were looking into electronic keys for some of the buildings, not all, as it would be costly.

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- ❖ Isabel Maldonado questioned Dr. Lopez as to why we weren't having our security staff letting people in, (doing a walk through) and locking up (doing a second walk through) when event finished, as was done in the past. Robert Gonzales said that could happen as soon as the following week. Jose Zavala is still interested in electronic keys.
- ❖ Raul Varela questioned if coaches return keys at the end of their season? Dr. Lopes explained that "Yes" they do so, confirming with Mr. Kirby & Mr. Jarrett. Mr. Kirby explained that he was aware there were issues with unauthorized use of the weight room and gym but he has addressed the issues and its better now. Dr. Lopez also explained that District staff will be able to use the weight room but must sign a release form.

Dr. Lopez gave an update on the progress on Washington Elementary; there is an expected delay on the outdoor canopy to September (8-10) but that the rest of the site would be open to staff starting in July (8-10). He also thanked Mr. Bautista and Ren Watkins for ensuring that the testing (SBAC) has been going smoothly. Dr. Lopez also informed the Board that Mr. Ochoa is having a "Seamless Summer Meal Program for our students with Michael Porras. This will start serving breakfast & lunch July 1st. Mr. Alcaide explained that the District will be reimbursed for the cost. He also informed that the Spring Academy was a success, thanked McCabe for their efforts. In closing, Dr. Lopez stated that his team takes all challenges in stride and works hard to make our district successful.
