



Proposition 30 added Article XIII, Section 36 to the California Constitution effective November 7, 2012. The provisions of Article XIII, Section 36(e) create in the state general fund an Education Protection Account to receive and disburse the revenues derived from the incremental increases in taxes imposed by Article XIII, Section 36(f). All monies in the Education Protection Act Account are continuously appropriated for the support of school districts, county offices of education, charter schools and community college districts. Each community college district, county office of education school district and charter school shall annually publish on its Internet website an accounting of how much money was received from the Education Protection Account and how that money was spent.

Fortune School received \$1,610,542 in funds from the Education Protection Account in fiscal year 2016-17. The funds were allocated between school sites and were spent as follows:
