Rooney, Ortiz address grads

Valedictorian Mary Rooney and salutatorian Carolina Ortiz represented Archbishop Molloy's Class of 2011 on Graduation Day on June 11 at Colden Auditorium at Queens College.

Rooney and Ortiz, who delivered speeches during the ceremony on the seniors' shared past at Molloy and on their futures at college, earned this privilege by having the Class of 2011's top academic averages in a close race that came down to decimal points.

The victors of such a close race were pleasantly surprised by the news.

Rooney said that she was "a little surprised," and "knew there was a lot of competition."

Ortiz was also surprised, but said that "once the initial shock went away, I was just happy. I couldn't wait to tell my family and friends."

When asked how hard she'd worked to attain that top average, Rooney said, "Honestly, this year I gave up [working hard] in January."

Ortiz said, "I'm sure if you ask any of my friends, they'll say I was a workaholic, but I never really noticed it most of the time."

Rooney, who intends to major in Chemistry in the fall at Hofstra University where her father is a professor, said before the ceremony she was "somewhat nervous" as she is "not really a public speaker."

Ortiz, who plans to major in Biology and minor in Creative Writing at the University of Pennsylvania, said it was "really daunting" when she realized that she would be speaking in front of about 2,000 people.

Ortiz said it took days to figure out a topic but in the end she liked her speech and hoped "everyone will enjoy it."


Public Speaking teacher Ms. Mary Pat Gannon, who worked with Ortiz and Rooney to prepare their speeches, said they had produced "wonderful first drafts" but needed to "work on how to 'sell' their message to the audience."

Ms. Gannon said, "I want everybody to be able to appreciate the mind that is up there and the message she is trying to convey."

These two Stanners have impressed many teachers over the years.

Ms. Gannon, who taught both Rooney and Ortiz, called Rooney "one of the most mature, sophisticated, intelligent minds I've seen in decades."

Ms. Gannon described Ortiz as "one of the best natural writers I've ever met" with an "instinctive ear for diction" who "falls naturally into a cadence of

parallel structure."

Mr. James Sheehan, who taught A.P. Composition to both Rooney and Ortiz, called Rooney, "one of the most observant students I've worked with in nearly 300 years of teaching."

He described her as "a kung fu warrior of academia — perceptive, amazingly intelligent and focused.

"Her many abilities and her mature sensibilities will make a difference in our world," he said.

Mr. Sheehan said that Ortiz was "deservedly a Gold Key winner of the Scholastic Arts national writing competition.

"Imaginative, insightful and intuitively aware of the world around her, Carolina makes magic with words, getting at the truth of things in her distinctive, compassionate voice," he said.

Mr. Michael DeMarco, moderator of Science Olympiad, called Rooney, who hopes to work one day in a FBI forensics lab, "one of the key reasons we took second place [in the city competition] this year."

He called her "talents in Chemistry coupled with hard work an unbeatable combination."

Mr. DeMarco said of Ortiz, who plans to become a pediatric oncologist, "Her skill in biology, good personality and bedside manner" would make her "a great doctor."

Rooney and Ortiz impressed their classmates as well.

"I asked Mary Rooney to sign my senior polo," said Eleni Kavvadias. "When she did, I drew a box around her name because I wanted the future President of the United States to have a special place on my shirt.

"When teachers don't know an answer to a question, they ask Mary Rooney," Kavvadias added.

Senior Christina Jarosch called Ortiz "the most caring and selfless person I know. She is like Wonder Woman. She inspires me."

Like many seniors, Rooney described her feelings about graduating as "weird."

"It seems like we had such a short time in high school," she said.

She hopes college will be "exciting" and looks forward to gaining "more independence."

Said Ortiz, "Graduating is both sad and happy. You're going to miss all your teachers, friends, and generally everything that makes Molloy great, but at the same time you're looking at a whole new beginning ahead of you. It's rather paradoxical."


Meli, Dorgler are top senior athletes

Basketball player Christopher Dorgler and soccer player Kyra Meli were named the Outstanding Male and Female Senior Athletes at Molloy's Sports Awards Night on May 24 in the Jack Curran Gym.

The vote among coaches to determine the male athlete of the year was particularly close as it took several rounds of voting to break a tie and pick a winner.

"This is a very difficult award to determine because of the outstanding achievements of our senior class," said Athletic Director Mr. Mike McCleary. "This year's finalists were all team captains and include an individual City champion, six All-League Players, a two-time Queens Player of the Year and City Player of the Year. They made All-Queens teams seven times, All-City teams seven times."

Mr. McCleary said that, as a group, the finalists for the awards won 16 Brooklyn-Queens Championships, four City Championships, one State Championship and one Federation title, **Continued on page 2**


