Art Club- (Mrs. Chalmers- MChalmers@tooeleschools.org, Mr. Wilcox- CWilcox@tooeleschools.org, and Mrs. Potter- FPotter@tooeleschools.org) Help design logos, enter contests, create murals and scenery for plays and participate in school activities like the Winter Tree Festival and services projects.

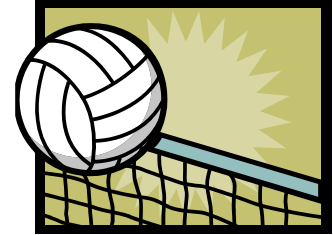
