Metro-Arts Dress Code

Updated November 2017

These rules were established to maintain a respectful atmosphere conducive to learning.

The clothing below is prohibited:

Tops

1. Tube-tops or exposed under-garments.
2. Bare midriff beyond approximately 3 inches (about the width of your hand).
3. See-through, low cut, backless or sideless shirts must be covered by non-revealing garments.
4. Shirts that carry profane, obscene, or offensive slogans or pictures.

Bottoms

1. Dresses need to be approximately mid thigh.
2. Shorts and skirts need to provide adequate coverage no matter how you move.
3. Tights or other types of hosiery must be accompanied by a top, skirt, dress or shorts.
4. All pants or leggings must be worn at the waist with no visible undergarments.

Other

1. Shoes must be worn at all times.
2. No body glitter.
3. No sunglasses in the classroom.

Note: The Administration at Metro Arts has the discretion to determine if a student's attire is acceptable and is not disrupting or distracting to the normal operation of the campus or any school related activities.

Dress Code Disciplinary Action:

Any student who violates the student Dress Code by dressing inappropriately will be

1. Asked to change clothes if the student has appropriate clothing in school with them.
2. Asked to call the student's parents to bring appropriate clothing to school.
3. Given the option to wear an appropriate shirt and/or sweat pants provided by the school.
4. Assigned in-school suspension for the day if the student refuses to dress appropriately.
5. A parent meeting will be called to address the code violations and the consequences.
6. Students with repeat dress code violations may be suspended off campus.
