



Leslie Lobel '70, emigrated from New York to Israel in 2002 with an MD degree and doctorate in virology from Columbia University. Dr. Lobel is a Professor at Ben-Gurion University of the Negev and a world-recognized virologist who has been researching a cure for hemorrhagic fever viruses, including Ebola, for a decade.

He has been studying Ebola at *Ben Gurion University of the Negev's* Center for Emerging Disease, Tropical Diseases and AIDS in southern Israel. Dr. Lobel visits Africa five times a year to meet with Ebola survivors and believes he is close to developing a cure.
