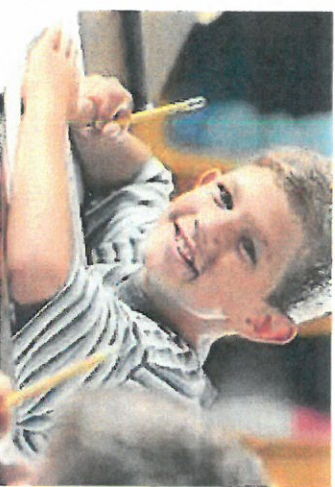

To apply:

- **SES Applications may be obtained at the SES Fair on October 24 at Glenwood Elementary and Linden Elementary or the District Office.**
- **Applications will be available from October 24 - October 31, 2013.**
- **The deadline to submit applications is October 31, 2013.**

State-approved SES providers will offer services anytime outside of the regular school day. After school is the most common time for SES to be offered, but it could also take place before school or on the weekends.

SES can be offered at school sites, community-based service site, in a student's home or over the internet.

Supplemental Educational Services (SES) Tutoring Program

Elementary & Secondary Education Act: Title 1 (also known as No Child Left Behind)
State and Federal Programs Department

What is Supplemental Educational Services (SES)?

SES is FREE tutoring provided under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA), also known as No Child Left Behind (NCLB) (2001). The SES tutoring program is for eligible students to improve their reading, and math skills.

Who is eligible for SES services?

All low-income students who are in grades K-4 and attend a Title I Program Improvement (PI) school in Year 2 or longer. Income eligibility is determined by the families free or reduced lunch status. Priority for enrollment is given to the lowest-achieving students from low-income families.

How does a school become a Program Improvement (PI) School?

Title I Program Improvement is a requirement outlined in the (ESEA) No Child Left Behind (NCLB) Act of 2001. This law identifies Program Improvement (PI) schools as those schools that have not met yearly growth targets for two consecutive years.

Who will tutor my child?

The parent(s) of an eligible student will select their child's tutoring program. The list of approved SES Providers (tutoring companies) is included in the SES Application and SES Matrix that were given to your child to take home. The SES Providers are approved by the CA State Board of Education. These SES Providers have expressed interest in delivering services in our district.

How do I choose an SES Provider for my child?

Below is a list of questions to consider when selecting a tutoring program for your child:

- In what subject does my child most need help (math, reading, and/or writing)? (Note: Only one subject can be tutored during the program)
- Which providers offer services in the subject my child needs help? For what grade level does the provider offer service?
- Will my child receive one-on-one instruction, be placed in a small group or receive only online instruction?
- Who will be tutoring my child? What training have they had? Qualifications?
- What day(s) of the week is/are the program(s) offered?
- When does the program begin and end each day?
- When will the program services begin and end during the year?
- Where (home, school, library) will the services be provided? How will my child get to tutoring? (Remember, transportation is not provided.)
- How can I monitor my child's academic progress during the tutoring program?
- How will the provider address the needs of students with disabilities?
- How will the provider address the needs of students who are English Learners?
- Do I need to have internet access at home to receive services from a provider?
