2014-15 Season:

After losing their first game of the season the Lady Bruins went on an impressive 14 game winning streak earning them a #9 ranking in the Mercury News Top 15. Late in the season the Lady Bruins suffered a season ending ACL tear to Senior Jessica Mok, ankle injury to Senior Samantha Yoshino, and concussion to Senior Ashley Parsons; with the senior leadership of Regina Sankey the team had to fight through the rest of the BVAL regular season. The Lady Bruins finished in 4th place with a record of 8-6 in the Mount Hamilton "A" Division.

Regina Sankey led the BVAL, CCS Division III and was #3 in the State for points scored at 677, averaging just under 24 points per game. Regina Sankey was awarded MVP Honors from the BVAL Mount Hamilton Division and she was also named to the elite First Team All-Mercury News Girls Basketball Team. Jessica Mok and Ashley Parsons were awarded 1st and 2nd Team All League Honors with both averaging just under 8 points per game. Mok was also awarded Branham's Robbie Deauville Spirit Award. Brianna Sasao and Alexa Lopez received All League Honorable Mention Honors as well, both averaging just over 4 points per game. The team was also awarded the Branham Scholastic Winter Team Champion Award with an overall GPA of 3.51.

The Lady Bruins earned a #6 seed in the Division III CCS tournament and a second round game against #11 Live Oak. A 58-52 victory in overtime advanced the team to play #3 seed Saratoga High School in the quarter finals at Mills High School. The Lady Bruins upset the Falcons 48-45 to advance to the semi-final game against #2 seed Notre Dame of San Jose. The Lady Bruins continued to take over, knocking off the Regents 53-47 earning them a spot in the finals against #1 seed Hillsdale High School. The Lady Bruins came out on fire against the Fighting Knights taking a 32-19 lead at halftime. The Lady Bruins continued to dominate, outscoring the Fighting Knights 15-14 in the second half to win the game 47-33 and allowed Branham to claim the school's first ever CCS Division III Girls Basketball Title. The title earned the Lady Bruins a #7 Seed in the CIF State Tournament where they ultimately lost to Patterson High school 43-56.
