The Garvey Board of Education met in regular session on March 9, 2017, at the Education Center, 2730 N. Del Mar Ave., Rosemead, California.

**CALL TO ORDER**

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m., by Board President Ronald Trabanino.

**ROLL CALL**

**COMMUNICATIONS/REPORTS FROM THE BOARD AND SUPERINTENDENT**

• **DELAC Report**

Toni Chen, DELAC Chair, presented a report from the District English Learner Advisory Committee (DELAC). She spoke of the progress and improvement made by students in English, reading comprehension, and Mathematics. The percentage in improvement exceeded the rate of improvement reported for the state and L.A. County for 2015-16, even when our District has more than 40% of EL students. She commended the school staff for encouraging the children to read at least 30 minutes daily to develop reading skills and vocabulary. The students are provided with after school tutoring, technology and language instructors to work in small groups to help them overcome the language barriers. Ms. Chen stated the District's curriculum is very good and rigorous and it is challenging enough to help students develop problem solving skills and pass the tests. Ms. Chen reported on the DELAC recommendations: 1) extend multiple opportunities to parents to attend trainings on ways to help children at home; 2) ensure that translation is provided for all parent meetings and trainings; and 3) continue to provide teacher training to support all EL students and their parents.

• **Communications/Reports from the Board and Superintendent**

Anita Chu congratulated all the students and staff participating in the Science Olympiad at Occidental

College this past Saturday. Hillcrest students received a gold place medal and Garvey Intermediate Schools placed 11<sup>th</sup> among 40 participating schools. Ms. Chu commended the teacher leaders, Teresa Chow (from Hillcrest) and Michael Naka and Teresa Tang-Quick (from Garvey) for helping these students succeed at this event.

Henry Lo indicated he participated last week in the Read-In event at Hillcrest School. Bob Bruesch noted the Science Olympiad and the Math Field Day which took place recently and the upcoming History Day event with at least three schools that will be participating, along with the Spelling Bee competition. Keilley Meng commented on the complex problems that students solved at Math Field Day event.

Maureen Chin congratulated everyone that took part at the recent Dinner and Show event at Temple Intermediate School. The student performers provided a wonderful dinner, great music, and a talent show.

Ronald Trabanino thanked all members who participated in these events to show support to our students.

#### **REPORT FROM HEAD START REPRESENTATIVE**

Dr. Sandra Gonzalez, Director of Head Start/State Preschool, and Veronica Borunda, Head Start Parent Committee Liaison, addressed the Board regarding the Child Development Services.

Ms. Borunda thanked everyone for addressing the safety concerns at Bitely School. She shared about a field trip for Bitely students to the Science Center in Pasadena.

Dr. Gonzalez spoke of the renovation of four classrooms at Williams School in preparation for the extended-hour program in 2017-18. She indicated that the program has just completed the annual self-assessment review required by federal regulations with focus on classroom quality. Ms. Gonzalez stated that the report showed that the District exceeded the minimum threshold and there was no need for a program improvement plan. The program is waiting for a report on the Federal review that was completed last month. The District received a letter from LACOE congratulating the teachers for doing a wonderful job through the review. Ms. Gonzalez spoke of four staff vacancies: one health specialist, one senior secretary, and two teacher assistants. She stated that staff will be working on a mass enrollment soon for next school year.

The Board approved to continue the Board meeting at Bitely School at 6:55 p.m.

#### **PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD FOR CLOSED SESSION AGENDA ITEMS**

Lisa Chan addressed the Board in support of Alma Guerrero and Dr. Dawn Berlin. Ms. Chan stated that in previous administrations, the services to students were slow and sometimes denied. Ms. Chan stated that her son has shown much more interest in school in recent months at Bitely School. Ms. Chan encouraged Board members to keep Ms. Guerrero and Dr. Berlin so they can continue to make a difference in Special Education students and the community.

Jennifer Rogers addressed the Board in support of Ms. Guerrero and Dr. Berlin. Ms. Rogers spoke of the remarkable progress made in timelines and compliance in the Special Education Department under the current leadership and the amount of time they spend in the classrooms, as well as, in communicating with the Special

Education staff. Ms. Rogers stated that both Ms. Guerrero and Dr. Berlin will continue to lead Garvey and help the District become a top 21<sup>st</sup> Century district.

Roxanna Daugherty spoke in support of Rice Teacher, Sam Martinchuk. Ms. Daugherty spoke of a fundraiser for a walk-a-thon and stated that she does not know what happened to the funds collected. Ms. Daugherty addressed other issues related to Rice School, such as, the school grass not being trimmed and a problem of having students come to school with head lice.

Phuoc Huynh, with help from a Vietnamese translator, addressed the Board in support of Sam Martinchuk. Mr. Huynh stated that his son has improved in reading and writing and that Mr. Martinchuk puts in lot of efforts to help his son succeed.

Kelly Martinchuk addressed the Board in support of Sam Martinchuk. Ms. Martinchuk stated that Mr. Martinchuk, is always practicing the *7 Habits of Highly Effective People*. Ms. Martinchuk asked the Board to consider rescinding the non-reelection of Mr. Martinchuk.

Rocio Vasquez, on behalf of Yodan Nguyen who could not be here tonight, stated that recently, approximately \$8,000 was raised from a walk-a-thon to buy college T-shirts for students but there is no evidence on the use of this money. Ms. Vasquez stated the dissatisfaction for the minimal support from Christina Hiraes, Principal of Rice School.

Sam Martinchuk addressed the Board regarding his non-reelection and the reason given that he is “not a good fit.” Mr. Martinchuk talked about the many years that he has volunteered at Rice School and the many hours he spends working with the students. He stated that he was directed not to speak with another teacher with the exception of the time needed for collaboration, there was no mentoring services provided to him, and there was a lack of timeliness in receiving his performance evaluation reports.

Pauline Gasca addressed the Board in support of Sam Martinchuk stating that her son’s attitude about school has improved greatly. Ms. Gasca asked the Board to reconsider Mr. Martinchuk’s non-reelection.

Virginia Romo, on behalf of the mother of her grandson, addressed the Board in support of Sam Martinchuk stating that Mr. Martinchuk has been very supportive of her grandson.

Dinh Doan, with help from a Vietnamese translator, addressed the Board and asked the Board the reason for the non-reelection of Sam Martinchuk.

Dori O’Shea, addressed the Board in support of Sam Martinchuk indicating that she has known Mr. Martinchuk for many years and that he has integrity and professionalism. Ms. O’Shea believes there is a lack of support and guidance from administration.

Violeta Zacarias addressed the Board stating that Mr. Martinchuk is very nice with the students and treats them with love and respect. She asked the Board to retain the services of Mr. Martinchuk.

Maria Rivera, with help from a Spanish translator, stated that some parents are upset to see the grandfather of another student mocking parents because they do not speak English; that they have voiced many times their complaints to the principal. Ms. Rivera is concerned for the safety of the students while they line up in the cafeteria. Ms. Rivera stated that she is in support of Mr. Martinchuk.

Maria Morales, with help from a Spanish translator, stated that her son has been bullied in school and he no longer wants to go to school; that some discussions about her son’s report card have been made in front of others and the principal has not done anything about this matter. Ms. Morales asked that there be no retaliation against her son. Ms. Morales stated that there is injustice with the non-reelection of Mr. Martinchuk.

Elva Flores, with help from a Spanish translator, described her unpleasant experience with the Special Education services for her son. She indicated she had secured a doctor's diagnosis for her son's autism but the services were denied by the District and that she was forbidden to be present during her son's evaluation by the school psychologist. Ms. Flores spoke of a car accident yesterday afternoon involving a Dewey student when crossing the street. Ms. Flores asked why there was no staff supervision at the time of the accident.

Bob Bruesch thanked all the parents who spoke tonight. He reminded everyone that due to some confidentiality issues, by law, the Board cannot decide or give answers at this time. These matters will be addressed during closed session.

Mr. Bruesch stated that he has brought up many times the need for a teacher evaluation that is aligned to teaching students for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century and he will not vote in favor of any teacher agreements until this matter is addressed by the Board.

#### **REPORT FROM UNION REPRESENTATIVES**

- **Garvey Education Association (GEA)**

Michael Drange, Treasurer of Garvey Education Association, addressed the Board on behalf of GEA President Ken Tang. Mr. Drange thanked Carol Mehochko and Dr. Sergei Orloff for coordinating the Math Field Day, one of the best run that the District has had.

Mr. Drange addressed tonight's agenda item regarding initial bargaining and commented that the District could include the matter of teacher evaluations on the District's proposal. Mr. Drange hopes that negotiations will be opened soon.

Mr. Drange addressed some of the issues expressed by the speakers tonight regarding the Special Education Department and the different perceptions among Special Education staff on the level of support provided to them by the District administrators. ### A. **2016-17 Second Interim Report and Fiscal Stabilization Plan.**

Anita Chu presented the 2016-17 Second Interim Report and Fiscal Stabilization Plan. The second interim report shows a positive certification indicating that the District will be able to meet its obligation for the current and two subsequent fiscal years. Ms. Chu described the changes in revenue, the required fiscal stabilization plan, and changes in expenditures as compared to the first Interim Report.

The Stabilization Plan, required by LACOE to address structural deficit spending, has been developed with input from Garvey Education Association (GEA) leadership. The plan specifies three measures to achieve a balanced budget: personnel cost management, reduction in expenditures, and assigning a portion of ending balance as “committed funds” for “Stabilization Arrangements” to restore the reserve level.

### B. **Title I and English Learner Program Evaluation Report.**

Anita Chu presented the Title I and English Learner Program Evaluation Report that includes an examination of two years of student assessment data on SBAC and CELDT results. The data are disaggregated by student subgroup and content area to identify areas of strengths and needs. The report specifies the high-priority student subgroups and content areas and describes the focus areas of improvement in student programs and services, professional development, and progress monitoring.

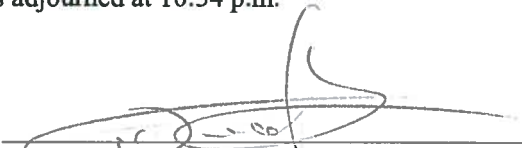
