



Student Dress Code

Dress Code The Governing Board of the Kern High School District has determined that appropriate dress and grooming contribute to a productive and positive learning environment. Frontier students are expected to wear clothes that are suitable for the school activities in which they participate. Student's clothing must not present a health or safety hazard or a distraction, which would disrupt the educational process.

The following guidelines shall apply to all regular school activities:

1. Shoes must be worn at all times. Slippers may not be worn to school.
2. Slogans, Illustrations: Clothing, jewelry and personal items (backpacks, purses, gym bags, water bottles, etc.) shall be free of writing, pictures or any other insignia which are crude, vulgar, profane or sexually suggestive, which bear tobacco, alcohol or drug company advertising, promotions and likenesses, or which advocate racial, sexual, ethnic or religious prejudice, or violence.
3. Sagging will not be allowed at Frontier. Baggy or oversized pants **MUST** be worn with a belt.
4. Students are expected to wear clothing that covers all body parts appropriately and conceals undergarments at all times (including bandeaus). Students wearing clothing that is considered to be disruptive, unsafe, or overly revealing will be referred to the Dean's Office at which time the appropriate action will be determined.
5. Dangerous attire which poses a hazard: (e.g.: steel-toed boots, chains, items with spikes or studs, etc.) are not allowed.
6. "Colors": The presence of any apparel, jewelry, accessory, notebook, or manner of grooming, which by virtue of its color, arrangement, trademark or any other attribute, denotes membership in a group or gang which advocates drug use, racial or ethnic disharmony, or which recommends violence or other disruptive behavior, is prohibited.

Consequences of Dress Code Violations

1st violation Student will be required to change into more appropriate clothing issued by the Dean's Office and exchanged back at the end of the day. Parent contact may be made.

2nd violation Student will be required to change into more appropriate clothing issued by the Dean's Office and exchanged back at the end of the day. Parent contact may be made.

3rd violation Student will be required to change into more appropriate clothing issued by the Dean's Office. Parent contact is made, and the student may be assigned an alternative to suspension or a suspension if student refuses alternative.

4th violation Parent contact and the student may be assigned a suspension (subsequent violations will result in additional days of suspension.)
