Student Code of Conduct

A major goal of the STEAM Academy@ Burke is to maintain a safe, healthy campus and classroom environment which is conducive to learning. Students enrolled at the STEAM Academy are expected to conduct themselves, at all times, in a manner that shows that they understand and accept the school policies and rules that regulate student behavior.

Administrative Office

The Administrative Office is open each day from 7:30 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. It is here that contact between homes and school is made and all other record keeping and regular school business takes place. Students must have a pass from a teacher for visiting any office during class time. Most student business will be conducted in the Attendance Office.

- 1. ALL VISITORS AND PARENTS ARE REQUIRED TO REGISTER WITH THE OFFICE PRIOR TO ENTERING CAMPUS.**
- 2. Students will not be called from class until the parent or guardian is present.**
3. Messages and other items will be delivered at the convenience of the office staff. Due to the disruption of class activities, flowers and balloons will not be delivered and may be picked up by the student after the final bell.
4. Students will only be allowed to use the office telephone for emergencies only. Students need to plan ahead. Repeated requests to use the phone for this purpose will be denied.

Student conduct is expected to conform to district and school rules and regulations. Violations of such rules and regulations will result in disciplinary action including, but not limited to the following, nor in the following order. For specific violations and consequences see the following pages.

1. Counseling and warning the student
2. A behavioral essay written by the student
3. Detention with the classroom teacher (Student will be notified one day in advance)
4. Campus beautification
5. Lunch detention (with administration)
6. Conference with student, teacher(s)
7. Conference with student, teacher(s), and parent
8. On-campus suspension
9. Saturday school
10. Suspension from school
11. Program change or intervention transfer to another school
12. Recommendation to the Board of Education for expulsion

VIOLATIONS AND CONSEQUENCES

VIOLATIONS AGAINST PERSONS

A. Fighting: Mutual combat in which both parties have contributed to the situation through either verbal or physical action.

Fighting: Students involved in a fight will be suspended.

Hitting: Students are not allowed to hit or play games that involve hitting of other students. Students that do so will be disciplined. Suspension may result.

Threatening: Students are not allowed to threaten other students, whether directly or indirectly. Students that do so will be disciplined. Suspension may result.

B. Assault or Battery: Assault is an unlawful attempt, coupled with a present ability to commit a violent injury to the person of another. Battery is an unlawful attack on another person.

1. Students may be suspended from three to five days.
2. Expulsion may be recommended.
3. If a severe threat or injury occurs, the sheriff will be notified.

C. Hazing: This is participating in or conspiring to engage in harassing acts that injure, degrade, or disgrace other individuals (This includes initiation into clubs or groups).

1. Depending on the severity of the act committed, consequences may include warning, detention, Saturday school, suspension, or expulsion.

D. Pantsing: Pulling down or attempting to pull down a student's pants or shorts.

1. Students will be suspended.

E. Throwing of Objects:

1. Throwing objects in general will result in campus beautification or detention.
2. Throwing objects at another person may result in detention, Saturday school, and/or suspension.
3. Throwing objects which can cause injury or damage will result in Saturday school or suspension.
4. Students will be held liable for damages to school or private property.

F. Physical Contact: Students are not permitted to hold hands, hug or kiss another student while on campus.

1. First violation, students will be warned.
2. Second violation, parents may be contacted; student may receive detention and/or Saturday school.
3. Subsequent violations will result in suspension.

G. Sexual Harassment: Unsolicited and unwelcome sexual overtures or demands, or offensive conduct of a sexual nature which inflicts embarrassment and discomfort on another. Some of the more obvious indications of sexual harassment include: offensive and unwanted physical

contact; offensive and unwelcome sex-oriented “kidding”, jokes or abuse; circulation of offensive material, and pressure for unwelcome social or sexual relationships.

1. Complaints must be reported to an administrator.
2. Law enforcement may become involved.
3. Depending on the severity of the act committed punishment may result in a warning, detention, Saturday school, suspension, or expulsion.

H. Hate Crimes: Students may not participate in acts of “hate crimes”, intimidation or supremacist activities of others. This includes verbal and written material.

1. Students will be suspended.
2. Expulsion may be recommended.
3. Law enforcement may be notified.

VIOLATIONS AGAINST PROPERTY

A. Extortion or Robbery: The taking of money or valuables under the threat of bodily harm, including the obtaining of property from another with consent, induced by the wrongful use of force, or fear of intimidation.

1. Students are not to ask other students for money.
2. Students will be suspended and law enforcement may be notified.
3. Extortion may also result in an intervention transfer to another middle school or expulsion from the El Rancho Unified School District.

B. Theft: The unlawful taking of property.

1. Student will be suspended.
2. Students must return the item or pay the cost of replacement.
3. Law enforcement may be notified.

Possession of lost or stolen property. *Any items found must be turned into the Lost and Found located in the office.*

1. Possession of such property is illegal.
2. Students may be suspended for possession of lost or stolen property.

C. Willful damage of school or personal property:

1. Any student who willfully cuts defaces or otherwise damages in any way property, real or personal, belonging to the school district or property of persons at school is liable for damages.
2. Student may be suspended.
3. Law enforcement may be notified.

D. Tagging: Writing of group or individual slang names. Use of tagging monikers is not permitted under any circumstances. This includes tagging of school property and personal items such as backpacks, book covers, notebooks and minder binders. Students are not allowed to use the “tagging” style of writing at school.

1. Students may be given detention, Saturday school or suspended.
2. Students found in possession of vandalism tools (paint pens, white out, white out pens, marking sticks, slap tags, etching tools, sharpies or other marking pens) may receive a citation for a court appearance from law enforcement and may be suspended.

VIOLATIONS AGAINST DECENCY AND GOOD MORALS

A. Gambling: Playing a game of chance for money or betting.

1. Students will receive detention or Saturday school
2. Students who continue in the same type of action will be suspended.

B. Vulgarity, Profanity, Name Calling and possession of Pornographic Material:

1. When directed at a teacher/staff member, the student will be suspended.
2. When used in the classroom or on school grounds, the student may receive detention, Saturday school or suspension.
3. Habitual profanity, vulgarity, or name-calling will result in suspension.
4. Pornographic material is not permitted at school. Violators may be suspended.

C. Cheating: Copying, cheating, or forgery are NOT allowed. Students caught doing any of these will be subject to disciplinary action by both the teacher and/or administration. **If a student allows another student to copy or cheat, they will receive the same punishment.**

D. **Dress Code:**

In compliance with Ca. Ed. Code sec. 48900-48925 and ERUSD, the STEAM Academy @ Burke has adopted a Standard Dress Code and a Partial Example of Prohibited Clothing and Items list. In an effort to provide a safe and orderly school environment for our students, we will maintain a school free from the harmful influence of any gangs or groups which advocate substance abuse, violence or disruptive behavior. It is the responsibility of the parents to see that

their child come to school appropriately attired. School personnel are responsible for maintaining proper and appropriate conditions conducive to learning. Failure to adhere to the provisions of this dress code will be considered a violation of Education Code Section 48900.K which provides for the suspension or expulsion of pupils if they have “disrupted” school activities or otherwise defied the valid authority of supervisors, teacher, administrators, school officials, or other school personnel performing their duties. The purpose of adopting these standards is not to infringe on any individual student’s right to freedom of expression, but rather to ensure the maximum safety of everyone, encourage students to dress for “success and learning,” and to attend school properly prepared to participate in the educational process. Our dress code helps us to identify people who do not belong on our campus. It prevents students from openly identifying with specific groups or cliques. It reduces problems associated with harassment and distractions in the classrooms. We appreciate and encourage your support.

STANDARD DRESS CODE

- **All students must wear a polo shirt.**
- **Polos may be any color and should have at most 3 buttons.**
- **If the polo has more than 3 buttons, the student must not have more than 3 buttons unbuttoned.**
- **The polo shirts may be either short or long sleeve, but not sleeveless.**
- **Shirts MAY NOT be worn over the polo shirt and undershirts must be tucked into the student’s pants and may not be hanging below the student’s polo shirt.**
- **All shirts extending below the student’s fingertips, when the student is standing, must be tucked in at all times.**
- Shoes must be worn at all times. **Sandals of any type and/or open toe shoes are NOT PERMITTED.**
- Pants/trousers length may not touch the floor.
- Shorts which are shorter than the student’s fingertips (while arms are at his/her sides) are prohibited.
- Attire that is altered in such a way to identify the student with non-school clubs, teams, or gangs is not permitted. This includes, but is not limited to: all oversized clothing and trousers with any slits, unhemmed pants and shorts, sagging pants, cut-off shorts with knee high socks, hanging belts, suspenders off the shoulders, and any initials on belt buckles. Clothing may not be taped, stapled, or tucked under for shortening.
- Trousers should be no larger than 2 inches at the waist. Trouser should NEVER be sagged.
- Attire that advocates or advertises any type of alcohol, drugs, or acts which are illegal, obscene, or hazardous to one’s health is NOT PERMITTED.
- Clothing which is sexually suggestive, extremely brief/excessively tight, low-cut so that it exposes the breasts or bra, is strapless, off the shoulder, exposes the bare midriff, tank tops, muscle shirts, undershirts, shorts or skirts which do not cover undergarments is NOT PERMITTED. Shirt straps should be 1” wide or larger.
- Clothing, including jackets, shoes, and accessories with logos, insignias or writing depicting alcohol or drugs are NOT PERMITTED.
- Head coverings of any kind may not be worn without the expressed permission of the administration.
- Tattoos which are visible are not permitted.
- Sunglasses are not permitted unless verification of medical necessity has been provided to the office.
- “Plug” earrings with pointed backs are NOT PERMITTED.

PARTIAL PROHIBITED ITEMS LIST

- Balloons and other birthday favors must remain in the office until the school day ends.
- All electronic devices including cell phones, MP3 players, CD players, electronic games, cameras, etc. (PLEASE REFER TO THE DISTRICT ELECTRONICS POLICY)
- Gambling devices—dice, playing cards, etc.
- Drugs, alcoholic beverages, narcotics, cigarettes, tobacco, cigarette papers, lighters, pipes, any product used as an inhalant, matches, lookalikes, paraphernalia, etc.
- Explosive devices, firecrackers, fire balls, cherry bombs, poppers, stink bombs, etc.
- Weapons, guns, knives, cake cutters, screwdrivers, or other dangerous items.
- Toys which are realistic imitations of guns and knives, etc.
- Gang identification paraphernalia, including but not limited to: beepers, gloves, rags/bandanas, clothing, etc.
- Tagging/Graffiti paraphernalia, including but not limited to: markers of any kind, “Mean Streaks,” paint sticks, spray paint, etchers, whiteout pens, and craft and/or X-acto knives.
- Belts or other items with spikes, chains, etc.

First violation Student will be required to change into PE clothes. Inappropriate article of clothing may be confiscated and parent may be called to pick it up.

Second violation Student will be required to change into PE clothes and may be assigned detention or Saturday school. Inappropriate article of clothing may be confiscated and parent may be called to pick it up.

Third and subsequent violations Student will be suspended from school

Should the student not have any P.E. clothes, Burke will provide garments which may be from our lost and found. **PLEASE BE REMINDED THAT CELL PHONES AND OTHER ELECTRONIC ITEMS CAN ONLY BE PICKED UP BY A PARENT (OR AN ADULT PERSON DESIGNATED BY THE PARENT) ON FRIDAYS BETWEEN 3-4:00PM. NO EXCEPTIONS WILL BE MADE.**

E. Internet Use: Students are expected to follow the guidelines of the El Rancho Unified School District Acceptable Use Policy. Students who violate acceptable use will lose their computer privileges. In addition, students who post photographs, threats, defamatory information displayed on the internet or other electronic media will be disciplined in accordance with California Educational Code. Consequences vary depending upon the circumstances including, detention, Saturday school, suspension and expulsion. Law enforcement may be notified.

VIOLATIONS AGAINST PUBLIC HEALTH AND SAFETY

Administrators may use dogs trained to detect contraband to conduct random searches for contraband in student lockers, other common areas and vehicles parked on school grounds. A qualified trainer and a school administrator will accompany the dogs. If a dog indicates that contraband is present on school property, administrators can conduct a further search. Violators may be subject to the districts first-offense alternative contract.

A. Narcotics/Controlled Substances: This includes the possession, use or distribution of alcoholic beverages, narcotics, or other dangerous drugs/controlled substances.

1. Violators will be suspended.

2. LA County Sheriff will be notified.
3. Expulsion may be recommended.

B. Paraphernalia: The possession of any drug paraphernalia (including lighters/matches) is prohibited.

1. Violators may be suspended.
2. LA County Sheriff may be notified.
3. Expulsion may be recommended.

C. Tobacco/Tobacco Look-Alike products: Students will be suspended for possession of tobacco products, look-alike products or smoking.

D. Breath Fresheners/Aerosol Deodorants: Liquid or spray breath fresheners contain alcohol and are not allowed at school. Students may not have aerosol deodorants or body sprays such as AXE, Tag, etc.

1. Student may receive detention, Saturday school, and be suspended.

F. Dangerous Objects: Knives, firearms, explosives, pepper spray/mace, other dangerous objects or weapons, including replica or look-alike weapons.

1. Students will be suspended.
2. Students shall be recommended for expulsion.
3. Law enforcement will be contacted.

PROMOTION REQUIREMENTS

****Beginning with the class of 2016 and every class that follows**

1. Students will need to maintain a cumulative (6th, 7th, and 8th grade years combined) GPA of 2.0 or higher.
2. No more than one U in citizenship for all subjects 2nd semester of 8th grade year only.

If the above requirements are met, students will be permitted to participate in the following 8th grade activities: 8th Grade Dance, Knott's Berry Farm Field Trip and Promotion Ceremony. The school principal will make the final determination for promotion to ninth grade based on the student's overall progress.

Lastly, promotion ceremonies will be held at the individual sites. Students will not be required to purchase gowns for this ceremony. While we want to celebrate those students who have met middle school criteria for promotion, we also want to emphasize the significance of a high school graduation by having students experience the traditional cap and gown ceremony when they complete high school.

VIOLATIONS AGAINST SCHOOL ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES

A. Willful Disobedience and Defiance: Students are expected to follow the directions of teachers, administrators and staff including cafeteria personnel, lunch supervisors, SSO, or other personnel.

B. Office referrals for disobedience, defiance, or disruptive behavior in the classroom: Students who do not follow directions may receive campus beautification, detention, Saturday school or suspension. Direct defiance will result in suspension.

C. Tardy Policy: Students are expected to be seated and ready to work **before the tardy bell rings**. Accumulation of tardies begins at the start of each quarter.

1st Tardy	Teacher warning to student. Note will be made in student's agenda.
2nd Tardy	Teacher warning to student. Note will be made in student's agenda.
3rd Tardy	Teacher assigns a 15 minute detention.
4th Tardy	Teacher assigns a 30 minute detention. Student will receive an automatic "N" in citizenship on the trimester report card.
5th Tardy	Student is sent to the office on a referral and the student is assigned a 45 minute detention.
6th Tardy	Student is sent to the office on a referral and the student is assigned a 1 hour detention. Student will receive an automatic "U" in citizenship on the trimester report card.
7+ Tardy	Student will be sent to the office on a referral will receive an hour of detention, and may be referred to SARB. <i>Students with 6 or more tardies are considered a serious attendance issue and may be referred to SARB (the district's Student Attendance Review Board).</i>

D. Absences: Students are expected to attend school daily. When students are absent with the prior consent of their parent/guardian, the parent/guardian is expected to contact the attendance office the day of the absence. Parents may report a child's absence during school office hours (7:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.) by calling (562) 801-5059 or they may report the absence online via our website. If parents are unable to call or fill out the online form, students must bring a signed note to the attendance office prior to their return to school. Absences and tardies must be cleared within 3 days. After 3 days, absences and tardies to school will not be excused. Any absence which is not excused within three (3) days becomes a truant. (Perfect Attendance means no day or period missed for any reason.)

If a student is removed from a class by a parent, he/she will be marked absent for that period.

Students will not be called out of class until a parent/guardian arrives.

Students will only be released to parent/guardian and/or emergency contacts documented on the emergency cards. Any person wishing to take a student off campus MUST show valid identification.

ALL VISITORS AND PARENTS MUST REGISTER WITH THE OFFICE BEFORE ENTERING CAMPUS.

E. Truancy: An absence without prior permission of a parent/guardian or school personnel. Students are considered truant if they are absent without permission or if they leave a class without permission including the P.E. area. In addition, students in public places during school hours may be cited by law enforcement. Students cited for truancy may be subject to one or more penalties including;

1. A fine of up to \$250
2. Court-approved community service
3. Parenting classes (for parents)
4. Students who are truant will be assigned detention or Saturday school.
5. Students may be referred to the District Office of Child Welfare and Attendance. Students and parents may then be summoned to attend a meeting with the School Attendance Review Board (SARB).

G. Failure to report to office on a referral, Administrative detention, or Saturday school.

1. Students who are sent to the office on referral are to sign in at the front desk and wait to be seen by an administrator. Students are not allowed to leave without the permission of the office staff. Students, who fail to report, fail to sign in, or leave the office without permission may be suspended.
2. If a student misses detention without permission, the detention time will be doubled. If the student misses again, he/she will be suspended. Repeated violations will result in suspension.
3. Saturday school is offered from 8:00 – 12:00 Saturday mornings on select Saturdays. This is supervised work time for offenses as an alternative to suspension. Students must arrive by 8:00 and sign in. If the student does not attend as assigned or misbehaves during Saturday school, the student will be suspended from school the following school day.

H. Skateboards, Roller Skates, Roller Blades, Scooters, and Motorized Scooters: Due to safety considerations, these items are not allowed on campus at any time. If found on campus, these items will be kept in the school office until they can be picked up by a parent. Repeat violators will be suspended from school.

I. Bicycles:

1. Only non-motorized bicycles may be brought to school. All bicycles must be chained and locked to the bike racks located by Rooms 26A and 25A.
2. Students are to wear helmets in accordance with the law.
3. Only students who bring bicycles to school are allowed in the bike area. Students are not allowed to meet in the bike area.

4. Bikes must be walked when on campus. Violators will lose their bicycle privileges.
5. The school district is not responsible for bicycles on campus.

J. Electronic devices:

Radios, CD players, iPod/mp3 players, video games, laser pointers, photographic devices, video cameras or similar equipment are **NOT ALLOWED ON CAMPUS**. These items will be confiscated, and kept in the office. Parents must pick up and sign out confiscated equipment Fridays between 3-4pm (*photo ID required*). Detention and/or Saturday School may be assigned. Students who continue to violate this rule or disrupt the educational process will be suspended. The school district does not assume responsibility for damaged, lost or stolen items.

K. Cell Phones: Students are permitted to have an electronic signaling device (cell phone) in their possession while on campus during the school day, while attending school-sponsored activities, or while under the supervision and control of a school district employee.

1. Although cell phones are allowed on campus they **must be turned off** (vibrate or silent is not allowed). Students are prohibited from using them in any classroom or inside any building at all times. Phone use is limited to before (prior to the first bell) or after school (following the dismissal bell) only. Students may not use their phones during passing period or lunch. **ALL CALLS DURING THE SCHOOL DAY MUST GO THROUGH THE OFFICE. IF A STUDENT FEELS SICK, THE STUDENT MUST BE SEEN IN THE HEALTH OFFICE. STUDENTS MAY NOT CALL THEIR PARENT ON THEIR CELL PHONE.** The school district does not assume responsibility if such devices are damaged, lost or stolen.
2. The use of cell phones or their ringing/vibrating during school hours or activities will be considered a disruption of school activities and subject to disciplinary action, including: confiscation, detention, Saturday School, suspension and/or expulsion.
3. Parents may pick up and sign out confiscated equipment **Fridays between 3-4pm** (*photo ID required*).

L. Lockers: Lockers are to be used for P.E. only.

1. Students must purchase the school P.E. Clothing and a lock and should label them accordingly (*Neatly printed first and last name, No tagging style of writing*). Students are responsible for laundering their P.E. clothes weekly.
2. Do not give the combination of your locker to other students (even best friends).
3. Students are not to share lockers or PE clothes. Wearing someone else's PE clothes may be considered theft.
4. Although school authorities respect the rights of students, their lockers and property, it should be made clear that the lockers are the property of the school.

Accordingly, school officials reserve the right to search lockers, desks or backpacks whenever there is reasonable cause or suspicion.

5. The school district is not responsible for personal property left in lockers. Students should not leave valuable items in the locker at any time and must ensure that their locker is locked securely.

M. Gum: Students are not allowed to bring or chew gum at school. This includes before and after school.

1. On the first referral, students may be assigned campus beautification to scrape gum.
2. On the second referral students may be assigned detention and/or Saturday school.
3. Subsequent referrals, students may be suspended for defiance of school rules.

N. Textbooks/Library Books: Students assume responsibility for all books issued/assigned to them. Students must sign out and sign in each book when requested. Failure to return a book will result in a fine, valued at book cost, being placed on the student's record.

FIRE CODE VIOLATIONS

A. Starting Fires: Lighting a fire, setting off a fire alarm, bringing, possessing or using fireworks or explosives, including firecrackers is not permitted. According to California Penal Code 12303.2... "It is a felony to be in possession of any explosive device at or near a school or any other public building." Students who assist in the lighting of fires are subject to the same consequences.

1. Student will be suspended
2. The Fire Marshall and/or Law Enforcement will be contacted.
3. The student and their parents are responsible to pay for any damages.

B. Possession of lighters or matches:

1. Student may receive detention and/or Saturday school.
2. Repeat violators will be suspended.

The program hours are from 3:00 pm to 6:00 pm on regular scheduled school days and 12:00 pm to 6:00 pm on modified days. SATURDAY SCHOOL: Saturday School may be assigned as a consequence for violating school policies. Students are notified verbally and/or via a referral or Saturday School notice of assigned Saturday School detention by their teacher or administrator. A student who misses Saturday School due to illness or other parental excused notice will be assigned the following Saturday. Students with a valid excuse will be reassigned up to two times, on the third rescheduled Saturday, a student must attend Saturday School or they will be suspended on the following Monday-no exceptions. Failure to attend an assigned Saturday School without a valid excuse from a parent/guardian may result in suspension.

Emergency Cards

In the event of an emergency, every attempt will be made to contact the parents if a student requires immediate medical attention. Every student must have an emergency card on file. It is the parent's responsibility to maintain current and accurate information on the emergency cards at all time. If there is a change in contact information, a parent must come in to the office in person to make the necessary changes. In the event of an emergency, only those listed on the emergency card will be allowed to take the student from campus.

Class Schedule Changes

If a student needs a class schedule change, the student must go to the school office and request a Schedule Change Form. The form will need to be filled out and turned in to the counselor in order for a student to be considered for a change of schedule. Final decisions on schedule changes are made by the Principal. *Schedule changes in the fall are not considered until after the first 3 weeks of school.*

Science Lab and Computer/Technology Equipment

A student may be assessed a fee for any damage or breakage to lab equipment and/or computer/technology equipment that they are deemed responsible for. The fee will be added to the student's account based on the replacement cost of the damaged or broken item.

Student Identification Cards

All students will be issued a school I.D. Card. This card must be in the student's possession at all times while on school grounds including after school and off campus activities and events. Although a student will not be required to wear the ID card, the student shall present his/her ID at any time when requested by any school staff or representative of the El Rancho Unified School District. It is the student's responsibility to obtain a replacement ID. Replacement ID's are available in the office at a cost of \$5.00.

ASB

ASB cards may be purchased in the school office or from a student council member during the school year. This card is available to all students for special discounts and privileges for school activities.

NOTE: No refunds will be given if the student is unable to attend an activity due to not being eligible for that activity.
