

## Developmental Areas Screened

Lombard School District 44 conducts several Pre School Screenings throughout the year for children between the ages of 3-5. Children are screened in the following areas of development:

Physical Motor: A child's motor ability is checked as to the use of various parts of the body and the possible awkwardness of movement for any one part (fingers, hands, feet, legs, etc.) or the body as a whole.

Speech & Expressive Language: The child's ability to speak and express him or herself. The whole process as well as a focus on specifics, i.e., Is the child difficult to understand? Does the child have an unusual rhythm patterns, etc.? Does the child have difficulty following directions?

Social Behavior: How a child responds to someone. The child is observed as they interact with the examiner, other people and the test materials.

Affective Behavior: The child's reaction to situations is observed, i.e., if a child is almost always very active as well as almost never interested in anything.

By early diagnosis of the above areas, it enables us to identify any problem or possible problem areas a child might exhibit. By early identification, we are able to begin remediation of problem areas at an early age. Research has shown the earlier this is done the sooner we can get lasting results. The screening process is one way to identify children who warrant additional full evaluation or examination in a specific area.

## Frequently asked questions

**How do I sign my child up for your program?**

Parents cannot sign their child up for our program. Children must qualify or be eligible for one of our programs. Children qualify based on special education needs or are eligible based on "At Risk" factors.

**Do I have to live in Butterfield's attendance area to attend the program?**

No, you do not have to reside in Butterfield's attendance area. Families must prove residency and reside in District 44's attendance boundaries to attend our program.

**Can my child be screened again if s/he passed and I want them to attend your program?**

Parents have the option to have their child screened again. However, if a child passed the screening they will most likely pass again.

**How will I know how my child did at screening?**

Within a few days after your child was screened, someone from the team will contact you with the screening results.
