

COCKRAM MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The following policies and procedures shall govern the establishment and operation of the Cockram Memorial Scholarship

1. This scholarship program and fund has been established to honor Fred and Annette Cockram, long-time dairy farmers and supporters of agriculture programs.
2. The recipient for this scholarship shall be a current graduating senior in Baker County, Oregon and must be a current 4-H or FFA member.
3. Applicants shall be planning to attend an accredited university, college, or community college with an agricultural major declared.
4. Applicants are required to apply for the Cockram Memorial Scholarship by including a letter of intent to major in Agriculture addressed to the Cockram Family, two letters of recommendation (one from a teacher and one from a community member), Current high school transcript, SAT scores and a completed application form.
5. The scholarship shall be awarded by the consensus of the family of Fred and Annette Cockram.
6. One scholarship in the sum of \$500 shall be awarded each year, provided the balance in the Cockram Memorial Scholarship Fund on January 30th of each year is deemed adequate to grant the full amount of the scholarship. This is a non-renewable scholarship.
7. Payments of scholarship grant shall be made to the applicable educational institution on behalf of the scholarship recipient. If the scholarship funds are not used within one year of the time given, the scholarship grant will be returned to the Cockram Memorial Scholarship fund for future use.
8. All applications must be completed and turned in by April 15th of each year to Michelle Kaseberg at Sterling Savings Bank, 1990 Washington Ave, PO Box 846, Baker City, OR 97814. The family members of Fred and Annette Cockram will render a decision by May 10th of each year.
