We've continued using trustland monies to pay for two Literacy Aides. These aides have become invaluable in their position of helping support the literacy in our classrooms. We really see an increase in reading abilities with our struggling young readers. (goal #1)

We purchased classroom computers for 2 grade levels. With the extra money we received, it was decided to purchase another classroom set (as was in our plan). These computers are already benefiting as teachers are finding ways to incorporate the computer usage into their lesson plans. (Goal #2)

We have also purchased the headphones for each computer as was in our plan. We have also purchased bulbs for projectors and printer cartridges for our printers. (Goal #2)

Finally, we have already purchased a lot of science lab supplies and we still have some money to use to get some supplies to start next year off with. With our added emphasis on science, we fully expect to see and increase in our science test scores. (Goal #3)

School Plan 2014 - 2015

Goal #1

A major goal at Northlake Elementary is to improve K-6 student reading achievement by increasing the number of students reading on grade level. With implementation of the new Utah State Core we have seen an increased need to improve student reading levels. Our end of year literacy test rests showed 78% of our students scoring at the proficient or higher level. This unfortunately was a decrease from the previous year. While we still saw a decrease, we attribute much of our success to our use of Literacy Aides in K-2 classrooms. As a goal, by the end of next year we would like to increase the number of students scoring at or above proficiency on our end of level reading tests to increase by 3%, or to 81%.

Reading

Academic progress is measured throughout the school year with DIBELS, DRA, District benchmark tests and our new SAGE tests. DIBELS reading assessments are used for progress monitoring of students reading below grade level. DRA is used as a diagnostic tool. End of level tests are used to check for school wide progress. We have yet to actually take the SAGE tests, so we are excited to see our results.

In addition, all teacher teams create common formative assessments designed to specifically target standards and skills of the Utah State Core. By processing the data from the tests, teachers can quickly and accurately identify weak areas of learning and implement targeted interventions.

For students reading below grade level, the Land Trust monies will be used to pay the salaries for 2 literacy aides. The aides provide interventions and targeted instruction to students identified as reading below grade level. Literacy aides work under the direction of Northlake Elementary Literacy Coach and work closely with classroom teachers in first and second grades. Individual and small group instruction supports students as they learn letters, sounds, and sight words. This additional support is vital to school goals of every student reaching proficiency on state end of level assessments. Progress monitoring data will be used to monitor student growth throughout the school year as well as common formative assessments to identify areas of need.

Update technology in the classroom and school level. Modern technology access in the classroom helps teachers provide students with state of the art instruction in reading, writing, science and all areas of the curriculum.

As our end of year tests are all going digital, we want to immerse students technology so they feel comfortable in using it. We will use this technology, specifically the laptop computers, throughout the year in using the SAGE formative site and Datawise to practice for our year end assessments. Analyzing the data from these formative assessments will help us identify and target areas of need.

Academic progress is measured throughout the school year with DIBELS, DRA, grade level formative tests, district benchmark tests, and SAGE tests. DIBELS reading assessments are used for progress monitoring of students reading below grade level. DRA is used as a diagnostic tool. The End of level tests are used to check for school wide progress on a yearly summative level. This will be the first year of the SAGE test, so we will get baseline test results following the administration of the 2013-14 SAGE test.

We use the program Utah Writes at least twice a week to improve our writing skills. We use both Datawise and the new SAGE Formative assessments for our classroom formative assessments that will identify weak areas of learning to target with interventions. In addition, we are focusing on improving typing skills in all grades K-6 and having classroom computers will improve this essential skill.

Northlake Elementary continues to purchase technology according to school technology plan. We are wanting to increase the amount of computers in the classroom. Specifically we are looking purchase laptops for the 2nd grade classrooms, but we will also look ensure all classrooms have a Promethean board, projectors and replacement bulbs, document camera, printers and printer cartridges, headphones with microphones (for imagine learning and SAGE), more school-wide student response systems (clickers), testing and grading software, as well as the Professional Development to effectively implement this technology. With the Dual Language Immersion program coming to Northlake next year, we will need to increase the amount of classrooms with this needed technology. We will not be able to purchase all this technology in one year, but hope to continue a yearly increase in the amount of instructional technology available to teachers and students. This will include purchasing technology to replace broken or outdated current hardware, (i.e. replacement projector bulbs). Technology provides opportunities for students to receive differentiated learning in reading, writing, and all other subject areas.

We have scored low on science test scores for multiple years now and we want to continue to target science and an area of improvement.
