

### Look what we are learning in Math!

1. Identify members of a set: set of apples, set of cars. Next count how many are in the set (up to 10).
2. Name a number one less and one more than a given number between 1 – 10.
3. Observe numerals in the environment. Count forward 0-60; backward 20-0.
4. Identify which number is larger between 2 numbers 0 – 20..
5. Game Idea: Play War with cards. Compare the 2 numbers and decide which number is larger or if they are the same.
6. Identify a penny, nickel, dime and quarter.
7. Name the missing number in a sequence.  
Ex: 7 \_\_ 9      \_\_ 11, 12      4, 5, \_\_

### Look what we are learning in ELA!

1. Practice recognizing capital and lowercase letters of the alphabet.
2. Have your child name words that begin with the t, f, b, m, i, u, c, o and n sound. Write the capital and lowercase letter of each.
3. High frequency words that we read daily in class are: a, can, see, I, school, the, no, go, am, to, is, me, my, you, and, like, Sunday, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, Saturday, it, in, on, am, and the.
4. Name words that rhyme. Ex: What rhymes with hip, sip? (made-up words are fine)
5. Be able to say your first and last name, how old you are, say when your birthday is, and the name of your school.
6. Write their name correctly (see above).
7. Know the difference between a letter and word and identify a space.
8. Sound out words phonetically

b-a-g = bag

s-i-t = sit
