Deborah S. Brown Memorial Scholarship

California School Employees Association (CSEA) Chapter 610 is pleased to offer the Deborah S. Brown Memorial Scholarship to the children of CSEA Chapter 610 members employed with Center Unified School District.

Ms. Brown was a valued Center Unified School District employee for more than 20 years. She spent much of her time in direct contact with students, and knew many of them by name.

She was dedicated to CSEA, and sacrificed considerable time and effort to improving the working conditions and benefits of her co-workers. Her dedication to her job and all those she worked with served as a model for all of us.

Ms. Brown's untimely death in 2003 left all those who knew her with a void in their hearts. At the time of her death, Ms. Brown was serving as President of CSEA Chapter 610. Ms. Brown is greatly missed by her family and coworkers, along with the many others she touched throughout her life.

CSEA Chapter 610 recognizes the importance of post-secondary education, and would like to assist the children of CSEA Chapter 610 members in furthering their education beyond high school.

Two scholarships will be awarded: \$ 250.00 each

To be eligible for the scholarship students must:

1. Be a graduating high school senior. The student is NOT required to be attending Center High School.
2. Have a parent who is a CSEA Chapter 610 member employed by Center Joint Unified School District.
3. Have a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher OR a GPA of 2.8 or higher during the fall 2017 semester.
4. Be attending a school of higher education beginning fall 2018. The student may attend a technical school, trade school, junior college, four-year University or other type of post-secondary educational institution. (Students will not be judged on their choice of post-secondary education.)

Each of the following must be returned with your scholarship application:

1. Official high school transcripts
2. One letter of recommendation (letters can be from teachers, counselors, coaches, administrators, or advisors from other extracurricular groups such as work or church.)
3. Completed essay (see prompt on following page)

Scholarships will be awarded jointly to the parent and student upon registration verification for the Fall 2018 semester.
