

			<b>1</b> Start a "chain of hearts." Cut out small hearts. Each day, write a reason you love your child on one and attach it to the chain.	<b>2</b> It's Groundhog Day. How many words can your child make from the letters in GROUNDHOG?	<b>3</b> Turn off the TV this evening! Plan on reading or playing games instead.	<b>4</b> Visit the library with your child. Check out a book about science.
<b>5</b> Make today Dictionary Day. Talk with your child about new words that he thinks should be in the dictionary.	<b>6</b> If you don't have time to read to your kids at night, read in the morning. It's a real "power breakfast."	<b>7</b> Talk with your child about why students who do homework earn better grades.	<b>8</b> Tell your child family stories you can remember from when you were a child.	<b>9</b> Take your child outside for a "listening minute." Each of you close your eyes and try to name the sounds you hear.	<b>10</b> Praise your child for something she did today. Make your praise as specific as possible.	<b>11</b> Choose a recipe from another country or culture. Prepare it with your child.
<b>12</b> Tuck a valentine in your child's lunch every day this week. Write a special "I love you" message on each.	<b>13</b> Read a textbook assignment with your child. Then ask your child to tell you about it in his own words.	<b>14</b> Tell and show family members that you love them.	<b>15</b> Give your child a measuring tape. Ask her to measure and record the dimensions of objects in your house.	<b>16</b> Look over your child's homework. Give compliments and helpful suggestions.	<b>17</b> Make an effort to reinforce manners today. Remind your child to say <i>please</i> and <i>thank you</i> .	<b>18</b> Help your child round up some friends and play a game together outside.
<b>19</b> Make up a secret code with your child. Use it to write notes this week.	<b>20</b> When your child has a problem, give him two possible solutions and let him decide which one to choose.	<b>21</b> Make up trivia questions about your family. Quiz one another at the dinner table.	<b>22</b> Challenge family members to write, eat or do other activities with the hand they don't favor.	<b>23</b> Play a game of tic-tac-toe with your child.	<b>24</b> If your child is unsuccessful at something, try asking, "How would you do it differently next time?"	<b>25</b> Take the whole family to the library. Be sure everyone gets some books.
<b>26</b> Bake a cake with your child. Allow her to decorate it.	<b>27</b> Invent a word with your child.
