<a href="#">CAEOP</a>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Applicant must be a graduating high school student who has made application to continue his/her education OR the applicant may currently be pursuing such a course of study in an institution of higher education.</li> <li>• Applicant must have maintained a grade point average of 2.0 or better in high school.</li> <li>• Applicant must have applied for admission to a post-high school accredited institution and plan to enter following the granting of the scholarship, or already be enrolled in an accredited college or university.</li> <li>• Applicant must be a resident of the State of California.</li> <li>• Applicant must intend to continue his/her education in the field of business administration or education.</li> <li>• Applicant shall be responsible for the completion and return of all required support materials to the CAEOP Scholarship Chairman before the deadline date.</li> </ul>	<p><b>December 11, 2017</b></p>
<a href="#">LEDA Scholars</a>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Currently enrolled as a junior (11th grade student) in a public high school</li> <li>• Applicant must be a U.S. citizen, permanent resident, or have been granted Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) status</li> <li>• LEDA Applicants should have an unweighted GPA of at least 3.6 and be ranked in the top 10% of their class</li> <li>• 90% of LEDA Scholars report a family income of \$66,000 a year or less. While we will review applicants who report higher incomes than this, admission to the program becomes unlikely if the family income reported is over \$85,000.</li> </ul>	<p><b>December 12, 2017</b></p>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• High school students should be graduating seniors with plans to attend a two- or four-year accredited university, college or vocational-technical school in the U.S., Canada or Puerto Rico</li> <li>• Students who are applying as full-time freshman to a four-year accredited, college or university that is located in the U.S.</li> <li>• Students who have a cumulative unweighted GPA of at least 3.3</li> <li>• Students who have a minimum ACT Composite score of 25 or a minimum combined SAT score of 1700</li> <li>• Students who demonstrate an active leadership role in community service, athletics, and/or similar co-curricular activity (such as student government, team sports, fraternal life, etc.)</li> <li>• Students who demonstrate substantial work experience</li> </ul>
