

Summer Economics Course 2018

ECONOMICS



Course Overview:

This course is a study of the United States market-oriented economics system. Students will gain an understanding of the principle forces of economics in both microeconomics & macroeconomics. Topics such as behavioral economics, consumerism, personal finance, American business, financial markets, and the economic history of the United States will also be studied. The textbook, Economics: Concepts & Choices, will serve as a guide to enhance the overall scope and sequence of this course.

Rationale:

In an increasingly interdependent world, students need to understand that everyone plays a vital role in the health and stability of any economy. It is imperative that students consider how both micro and macroeconomics operate and the role that they play in it. **Economics is NJ graduation requirement**

Course Requirements:
