REGISTRATION POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

- A registration form and schedule for planning are included as inserts in this booklet and on the SMCHS website.
- Students are not considered registered until all forms have been completed and fees have been paid.
- Payment in full is due at the time of registration. Please refer to “Key Dates” for late fees.
- No registration will take place after June 22nd.
- Schedules will be mailed to all registered students on June 20th. Students registering after June 20 will pick up their schedules on the first day of Summer School.
- Enrollment is co-ed and is open to students entering 9th through 12th grades. Students with known disciplinary issues, however, will not be permitted to attend.
- Students from schools other than SMCHS should check the transfer credit guidelines with their guidance counselors PRIOR to enrolling in a summer course at SMCHS.
- Each class requires a minimum enrollment of 6 students. Classes which do not meet the minimum enrollment criteria will be cancelled and a refund will be issued.
- Students may enroll in up to three (3) courses. Due to scheduling constraints, all course requests may not be possible
- Enrollment is on a first come, first served basis with priority given to SMCHS students.
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PLEASE NOTE:

Classes may be cancelled based on low enrollment. Please verify class availability prior to purchasing textbooks. Fees for classes without sufficient enrollment will be refunded by mail. If a student leaves during the summer session due to disciplinary reasons, or if a student exceeds the maximum number of absences and chooses to leave because he/she will not receive credit for the course, NO REFUND WILL BE ISSUED.

The schedule of classes is subject to change based on student demand and teacher availability. Every effort is made to accommodate the greatest number of students. Notification of changes to the published schedule will be made as early as possible.

POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

ATTENDANCE

- Students are expected to attend every class.
- Students missing more than two days of a class regardless of the reason, will receive no credit for the course.
- Two tardies are equivalent to one absence.
- Students must take final exams on July 27th. Early exams are not administered.
- July 4th is a summer school holidays.
- A parent must report an absence as early as possible by calling (310) 394-3701. The student must bring a note to his/her teacher on the day he/she returns.
- Failure to clear an absence via parent note may result in dismissal with no refund.

I.D. BADGES

All SMCHS summer school students will be issued a picture I.D. the first day of school. To maintain security, these IDs **MUST** be worn and be visible on the upper torso at all times while on SMCHS grounds. Students who repeatedly fail to wear an ID badge may be sent home. Students will be charged \$5.00 to replace lost or damaged ID badges.

DRESS CODE

- While on campus, neat, modest, and appropriate dress is required.
- All tops must have sleeves.
- Bathing suits, tank tops, muscle shirts, bare midriffs or any other revealing attire is not permitted.
- Shorts, skirts, and dresses must be worn at the knee. If at any time the length appears two (2) inches or more above the knee, students may be sent home.
- No oversized or form fitting pants shorts, or cutoffs are permitted.
- No leggings are allowed.
- No flip flops or beach sandals are allowed.
- Closed-toe shoes must be worn at all times.
- Visible tattoos are not permitted.
- Clothing may not have inappropriate (e.g., drugs, alcohol, profanity) logos/designs.
- Extremes in hairstyle and color, jewelry, (facial/body piercings) and make-up are not permitted.
- Students who do not adhere to the dress code will be sent home and will not receive credit for classes that day.

The Summer School Director reserves the right to make final decision regarding all areas of grooming and appearance.

ENTERING FRESHMAN PROGRAM

The ENTERING FRESHMAN PROGRAM is designed to help incoming 9th graders prepare for success in high school. While most classes are open to any incoming freshman, three courses are open only to designated SMCHS incoming freshmen: Language Arts Skills, Math Skills and Algebra 1 Competency. Preference in enrollment is given to incoming St. Monica students. Freshman course fees are listed after each course description. Unless otherwise noted, students must purchase the required textbooks.

REQUIRED COURSES

Language Arts Skills **

Period 1 and 2 – no credit (EN098)

This course emphasizes reading comprehension, vocabulary, writing skills and fundamental grammatical rules. The required summer reading novel for incoming 9th graders will be covered as well.

Fee: \$300 (includes book-loan fee for texts; however, students must supply their own summer reading books)

Math Skills **

Period 1 and 2 – no credit (MA096)

This course is designed to prepare students for Algebra I or Algebra IA. Areas of focus will include computational skills needed to succeed in Algebra I or Algebra IA.

Fee: \$300 (includes book-loan fee)

ELECTIVE COURSES

Algebra I Competency***

Period 3 – 5 units (MA193)

Students must score appropriately on the math placement exam given in June to qualify for the course.

This course covers topics typically covered in the second half of high school Algebra. It is designed for students who have completed 8th grade Algebra and wish to qualify for Geometry/Geometry Honors in the fall. Students earning an “A” or “B” will be placed in Geometry/Geometry Honors. Students earning a grade of C or lower will be placed according to the initial placement indicated on the admissions letter.

Fee: \$300 (includes book-loan fee)

Art I*#

Period 1 – 5 units (FA501)

This course provides an introduction to visual literacy and to the aesthetics of two-dimensional design through drawing. Projects include drawing from life as well as from imagination.

Fee: \$300 (includes art fee and supplies packet)

Art II*#

Period 2 – 5 units (FA502)

This course is the continuation of Art I. Completion of Art I or concurrent enrollment in Art I is required.

Fee: \$300 (includes art fee and supplies packet)

Ceramics I*#

Period 3 - 5 units (FA504)

This course is an introduction to ceramic design and construction using basic hand building techniques such as pinch, coil, slab and with an introduction to wheel throwing.

Fee: \$300 (includes art fee and supplies packet)

English Prep

Period 1 – 5 units (EN099)

This elective course prepares entering 9th graders for high school English in the areas of high school level reading, writing, and academic success skills such as note taking, time management and test taking. Some class time will be used to incorporate SMCHS summer reading.

Fee: \$300 (includes book-loan fee for texts; however, students must supply their own summer reading books)

Introduction to Health *

Period 2 - 5 units (PE190)

This course includes the study of emotional and psychological health, stress management, substance abuse (including tobacco and alcohol), communicable and non-communicable diseases, human sexuality, components of physical fitness, nutrition, and how to be a health-literate consumer. This curriculum for this required course is designed in accordance with the *Health Education Framework* as set by the California Department of Education and in adherence to Catholic teaching.

Fee: \$300 (includes book-loan fee)

ONLINE: Intro to Health*

5 units (PE191)

This online course includes the study of emotional and psychological health, stress management, substance abuse (including tobacco and alcohol), communicable and non-communicable diseases, human sexuality, components of physical fitness, nutrition, and how to be a health-literate consumer. The curriculum for this required course is designed in accordance with the *Health Education Framework* as set by the California Department of Education and in adherence to Catholic teaching. Students will be required to attend an introductory in-person class session and a concluding in-person session. Meeting dates TBD.

Fee: \$300 (no textbook required)

Coed Physical Education *

Period 3 - 5 units (PE090)

This course focuses on components of exercise and physical fitness, with an emphasis on weight training fundamentals and aerobic activity and is geared toward the beginner. An SMCHS PE uniform is required.

Fee: \$300 (no textbook required)

Tennis *

Period 1 - 5 units (PE507)

Skills and conditioning relevant to Tennis will be taught for all levels: beginner, intermediate and advanced. Students will be able to compete either on a social, intermediate or advanced level by the end of the course. Students must secure their own racquet. This course fulfills the SMCHS P.E. requirement.

Fee \$300 (includes court rental cost-no textbook required)

Freshman Football Conditioning

Period 0 (6:00-7:40am) - 2.5 units (PE593) MWF

This class is a rigorous conditioning program for incoming SMCHS freshman football team players. **All students enrolled in Freshman Football Conditioning must have a current physical examination on file in Family I.D. prior to the first day of summer school.** Physical exam forms and information about Family I.D. are available on the school website and in the Main Office.

Fee: \$150

HIGH SCHOOL PROGRAM

REVIEW COURSES

Review courses are only open to students currently enrolled in grades 9-12 who have already attempted the course and failed to complete it satisfactorily. Courses are open to all 9th-12th grade students who fit the criteria, but preference will be given to SMCHS students if classes become full. All classes are five (5) units which is the equivalent of one semester. Students improving a grade of D do not earn additional credits, as credits have already been assigned for that course.

In order to better meet the academic and scheduling needs of SMCHS students, English, Math and Science Review courses will be taught in a blended learning style. Content and assessments will be provided through an online content provider. A subject teacher will provide academic support, monitor progress and grade assessments. In the science courses, the teacher will conduct lab sessions. Daily class attendance is required. All Math and Science review courses are UC/CSU approved.

ENGLISH

English 9A R

Period 3 (EN191) - 5 units

This course is for students who wish to improve their English skills and/or grade for 1st semester.

Fee: \$300

English 9B R

Period 3 (EN192) - 5 units

This course is for students who wish to improve their English skills and/or grade 2nd semester .

Fee: \$300

English 10A R — British Literature *

Period 3 (EN290) - 5 units

This course is for students who wish to improve their English skills and/or grade for 1st semester.

Fee: \$300

English 10B R — British Literature *

Period 3 (EN2901) - 5 units

This course is for students who wish to improve their English skills and/or grade for 2nd semester.

Fee: \$300

English 11A R — American Literature *

Period 3 (EN391) - 5 units

This course is for students who wish to improve their English skills and/or his course is for students who wish to improve their English skills and/or grade for 1st semester.

Fee: \$300

English 11 B R — American Literature *

Period 3 (EN392) - 5 units

This course is for students who wish to improve their English skills and/or his course is for students who wish to improve their English skills and/or grade for 2nd semester.

Fee: \$300

MATHEMATICS

Algebra IA R *

Period 1 and 2 (MA191)) - 5 units

This course is for students who wish to improve their algebra skills and/or grade. This course reviews either semester of Algebra IA or the first semester of Algebra I.

Fee: \$300

Algebra IB R *

Period 1 and 2 (MA192)) - 5 units

This course is for students who wish to improve their algebra skills and/or grade. This course reviews either semester of Algebra IB or the second semester of Algebra I.

Fee: \$300

Geometry R A *

Period 1 and 2 (MA291)) - 5 units

This course is for students who wish to improve their geometry skills and/or 1st semester grade to proceed to Algebra II.

Fee: \$307

Geometry R B *

Period 1 and 2 (MA292)) - 5 units

This course is for students who wish to improve their geometry skills and/or 2nd semester grade to proceed to Algebra II.

Fee: \$300

Algebra II A R *

Period 1 and 2 (MA390)) - 5 units

This course is for students who wish to improve their Algebra II skills and/or 1st semester grade.

Fee: \$300

Algebra II B R *

Period 1 and 2 (MA391)) - 5 units

This course is for students who wish to improve their Algebra II skills and/or 2nd semester grade.

Fee: \$300

RELIGIOUS STUDIES

Religious Studies RA & RB *

Online (RS 190/290/390/490)) - 5 units

This online course is for students who must improve a failing grade Religion. Course work corresponds to the appropriate grade level and semester needing remediation.

Fee: \$300

Christian Service R-1st /2nd Semester *

(RS 100/200/300/400) TBA 2.5 credits

In this independent course, students will make up deficient credit for first or second semester. This course includes individual service completed off-site, submission of written work and the completion of a final presentation. There will be two mandatory meetings with the instructor at the beginning and end of the summer sessions (dates/times TBD). To receive credit, all hours and final Christian Service essays and/or presentations MUST be submitted to the instructor by July 28th.

Fee \$100

SCIENCE

All science review courses offered at SMCHS summer session will include the required lab experiences necessary to assist students' understanding of the science content and meet the expectations of a college-preparatory science course.

Biology R A *

Period 1 and 2 (SC292) - 5 units

This course is for students who wish to improve their Biology knowledge and/or first semester grade.

Fee: \$300 (includes lab fee)

Biology R B *

Period 1 and 2 (SC 293) - 5 units

This course is for students who wish to improve their Biology knowledge and/or second semester grade .

Fee: \$300 (includes lab fee)

Chemistry R A *

Periods 1 and 2 (SC 590)) - 5 units

This course is for students who wish to improve their Chemistry knowledge and/or grade for the first semester.

Fee: \$300 (includes lab fee)

Chemistry R B*

Period 1 and 2 (SC591)) - 5 units

This course is for students who wish to improve their Chemistry knowledge and/or grade for the second semester.

Fee: \$300 (includes lab fee)

Introduction to STEM R A*

Period 1 and 2 - (SC190) - 5 units

This course is a review of first semester of Introduction to STEM intended for students who need to review the first semester Intro to STEM content and/or improve their grade.

Fee: \$300

Introduction to STEM R B*

Period 1 and 2 - (SC191) - 5 units

This course is a review of second semester of Introduction to STEM intended for students who need to review the first semester Intro to STEM content and/or improve their grade.

Fee: \$300

WORLD LANGUAGE

Spanish I or II R *

Period 2 (FS190/290) - 5 units

This course is for students who wish to improve their Spanish I or II skills and/or grade and in order to proceed to the next level of Spanish. There is differentiated instruction for Spanish I and Spanish II.

Fee: \$300

ADDITIONAL COURSE OFFERINGS

Courses listed below are open to students who wish to either wish to fulfill graduation requirements or take courses for enrichment during the summer.

Art I * #

Period 1 – 5units (FA501)

This course provides an introduction to visual literacy and to the aesthetics of two dimensional design through drawing. Projects include drawing from life as well as from imagination.

Fee: \$300 (includes art fee and supplies packet)

Art II * #

Period 2– 5 units (FA502)

This course is the continuation of Art I. Completion of Art I or concurrent enrollment in Art I is required.

Fee: \$300 (includes art fee and supplies packet)

Ceramics I*#

Period 3- 5 units (FA504)

This course is an introduction to ceramic design and construction using basic hand building techniques such as pinch, coil, slab and with an introduction to wheel throwing.

Fee: \$300 (includes art fee and supplies packet)

Honors Geometry * #

Periods 1 & 2– 10 units (MA202 /MA202S)

This is an honors level course for students who wish to meet the Geometry prerequisite in order to take Algebra II Honors in the fall. Students enrolled in Geometry will be in class for two periods per day. **PLEASE NOTE: The class moves at an accelerated pace and will require frequent assessments and substantial outside work.** Students must meet the prerequisites for Honors Geometry and acquire prior approval from the Math Department Chairperson.

Fee: \$600

Introduction to Health *

Period 2 —5 units (PE190)

This course includes the study of emotional and psychological health, stress management, substance abuse (including tobacco and alcohol), communicable and non-communicable diseases, human sexuality, components of physical fitness, nutrition, and how to be a health-literate consumer. This curriculum for this required course is designed in accordance with the *Health Education Framework* as set by the California Department of Education and in adherence to Catholic teaching.

Fee: \$300

ONLINE: Intro to Health*

5 units (PE191)

This online course includes the study of emotional and psychological health, stress management, substance abuse (including tobacco and alcohol), communicable and non-communicable diseases, human sexuality, components of physical fitness, nutrition, and how to be a health-literate consumer. The curriculum for this required course is designed in accordance with the *Health Education Framework* as set by the California Department of Education and in adherence to Catholic teaching.

Fee: \$300

Coed Physical Education *

Period 3- 5 units (PE 090)

This course focuses on components of exercise and physical fitness with emphasis on weight training fundamentals and aerobic activity. The class is geared toward the beginner. An SMCHS PE uniform is required.

Fee: \$300

Football Conditioning

Period 0 6:00am– 7:40am– 2.5 units (PE591) MWF

This class is a rigorous conditioning program for retuning SMCHS football team players (grades 10-12). **All students enrolled in Football Conditioning must have a current physical examination on file through SMCHS Family I.D.**
