School District and Community: Riverdale High School is a four year school in the Rutherford County Public School System and has recently been named a **2017 Reward School as a top 5% school in the State of Tennessee**. Riverdale is located in Murfreesboro, Tennessee, one of the fastest growing cities in the United States. Murfreesboro currently has a population over 130,000 but the number is expected to go over 150,000 in a special census next year. The city is 34 miles southeast of Nashville, Tennessee. Rutherford County Schools have over 43,000 students and 47 schools, with additional new schools approved to be built in the coming years. Riverdale High School has approximately 2,075 students with 485 in the senior class. The school follows the semester system with $\frac{1}{2}$ credit earned per course per semester. Riverdale is on a 7 period day and the school year is 180 days. The mission of Riverdale High School is “To maintain a comprehensive educational program in a safe, learning environment that will encourage students to achieve their potential and become productive citizens. It is a lifelong commitment to Excellence! **The graduation rate for Riverdale is 95.8% and the average ACT is 20.8.**
