Small Business Scrip Program

Hello Carver Parent:

If you own a small business and want to participate in the selling of gift cards or certificates through the Carver Scrip program, then here's how you do it.

Carver Scrip is a program aimed at enriching our students' education through the sale of gift cards to our supporters. Scrip is a gift card program that generates funds for the school. Merchants allow our school to buy gift cards at a reduced rate and the school sells them to our supporters at face value. The funds generated from this program are earmarked to help fund our computer program.

When you enroll your business, we will place your businesses' gift cards/certificates on our special order form for customers and supporters to view. If the customers/supporters are in need of your services, they will place an order in an amount specified.

What you need to do is simple; just design a gift card or certificate with the specified denomination amount and determine the percent discount you would like to set for your contribution to the school. For example, if you own a restaurant then your Scrip order form may look like this:

This means that for every amount we sell through the Scrip gift cards/certificates, Carver receive 8 percent from the business owners. The funds that are generated through this program go a long way to help our students receive the best education possible, thanks to businesses such as yours.

Once we receive an order for your gift card/certificate, we will then contact you to order your business' gift card(s) or certificate(s).

We will write you a check to purchase the gift card(s) or certificate(s) from you. The buyers of your card will then use the card/certificate to purchase products from your business
