

Kindergarten Classes - Week 8

Dear Parents,

***** Please remember to initial your child's behavior calendar in his or her communication folder every day as well as look through your child's work and remove it from the folder. Please have your child read the take-home reader that is sent home in the book bag at least three times and then sign the parent confirmation sheet that is in the book bag.***

1. Answer word problems with answers up to 10. Such as: If I have 4 apples, how many more apples would I need to have 10 apples?
2. Sort items by color, shape, and size.
3. Identify members of a set: set of apples, set of cars. Next count how many are in the set (up to 10).
4. Observe numerals in the environment. Count forward 0-60; backward 20-0.
5. Identify numbers 0 – 10 (not in numerical order). Write these numbers.
6. Show your child 2 numbers between 1-20. Ask which number is bigger. Ex: 17 13
7. Which number comes before or after.
Examples: 5 ____ 7 / ____ 9 10 / 15 16 ____
8. Practice recognizing and writing capital and lowercase letters of the alphabet.
9. Have your child name words that begin with the d, s, t, b, a, c, i, m, u, f, g, o, and n sound. Write the capital and lowercase letter of each.
10. Write their first and last name correctly (see above).
11. Begin blending sounds together: b-a-g = bag
12. High frequency words that we read daily in class are: a, can, see, I, school, are, the, am, like, go, me, my, the, is, it, in, on, of, you, do, does, your, where, many, like, yes, one, two, three, four, five, Sunday, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, Saturday, and to.
13. Name words that rhyme. Ex: What rhymes with hip, sip? (made-up words are fine)
14. Be able to say your first and last name, how old you are, say when your birthday is, and the name of your school.
15. Identify and read words that have these word chunks (phonograms) in them: ee, ay, all, oy, or, ow, ou, sh, ch, and th.
16. Say the pledge to the United States flag.
