

What is PBIS?

Positive Behavior Interventions & Support (PBIS) is a program that seeks to impact the learning environment in order to support high student performance and reduce behavioral problems. Students will be taught rules and expectations that should govern behavior throughout the campus. Posters will be displayed in all environments in order to remind students of expectations.

The school staff will adopt a common approach to discipline that is proactive, instructional, and outcome based. Students will receive rewards and incentives on a weekly basis for maintaining the established expectations. Students who have met behavioral expectations for the entire grading period will participate in a Themed Day immediately following that six-weeks..

What are PANTHER Bucks and how can my child receive one?

PANTHER Bucks are the school's PBIS currency. They are opportunities for the Sunset Staff members to recognize your child for demonstrating the expected behaviors of a SES PANTHER. PANTHER bucks can be earned daily for such things as being in full uniform compliance, having all class materials, bringing back correspondence between school and home.....etc. Most Fridays your child will have the option of using their PANTHER bucks to purchase/participate in such things as jean/free dress days, crazy hair, crazy socks, candy drinks, other concessions as well as supervised free time in the afternoon.

What are the expected behaviors of a SES PANTHER?

All SES PANTHERS are expected to incorporate/exhibit the following behaviors in their daily routines:

BEING RESPONSIBLE,

BEING RESPECTFUL,

and BEING SAFE.
