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PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS

AUTOMOTIVE TECHNOLOGY – Do you love cars and have an interest in learning more about them and how they operate? This workshop will help you learn more about working on cars and focus on front-end service, brakes, and tire changing.

BIOMEDICAL (SCIENTIFIC RESEARCH) – Can you solve the mystery? A body is found on the Biomedical classroom floor. Use forensics science and biotechnology to solve the mystery and determine the cause of death. We will perform fingerprint, hair, DNA, and blood spatter analysis. Solve the mystery and win a prize!

CARPENTRY – Middle school students will have their choice of constructing a birdhouse or a flower box. Materials are provided, and participants will glue, hammer and sand off their project to take home with them.

CULINARY ARTS – Students will experience multiple stations which include: napkin folding, table set-up, chocolate dipped strawberries, garnish demo (apple bird carving, lemon twist, tomato rose, carrot curl), bread demo (braids, knot rolls, cloverleaf rolls), bananas foster, chocolate chip cookie prep and bake. Proper sanitation will be discussed and utilized.

DIESEL TECHNOLOGY – Come and explore a career as a Diesel Technician. If you are interested in construction equipment, mining equipment, marine diesel engines, and tractor trailers then this is your chance. Come explore our equipment, build your own hydraulic cylinder and learn how to service our diesel engines with the help of one of our technicians. Do you have what it takes? Come and find out!

EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION – Learn and teach to make slime! Participants will be given a recipe and will practice teaching peers how to make slime. After, students will discuss why they think slime can be useful in an early childhood classroom and will learn ways to have young children interact with slime that is beyond typical.

HEALTH (MEDICAL) OCCUPATIONS – Get your goggles, scrubs, gloves and gowns ready to have fun with the Health Occupations students participating as a doctor or nurse in simulation medical scenarios: physical injuries, wound care, heart condition, diabetes, and more.

LAW ENFORCEMENT – Round robin demonstration including handcuffing/searching, police baton and tactical team maneuvers and learning to take fingerprints. Participants will also be given a tour of the classroom and hear about the law enforcement program at HCTC.

MARINE SERVICE TECHNOLOGY – Compete in the HCTC Rain Gutter Regatta! Students will plan and build their very own sailboat using various materials and principles of boat building. Then students will put their design to the test, going head to head against the other campers to see who will come out on top (or afloat!).

MULTIMEDIA DESIGN – Workshop participants will use Adobe After Effects to create special effects, digital animation and motion graphics. Students will learn how to animate objects, create masks and edit green screen footage.
