V. REPORTING OUT OF CLOSED SESSION

.01 CONFERENCE WITH LEGAL COUNSEL-ANTICIPATED LITIGATION PURSUANT TO GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 54956.9(b). ONE MATTER

Governing Board Clerk/President Pro Tem Rochelle Smith read the following statement.

First, we would like to read into the record this statement which is unanimously supported by the four trustees in attendance:

"The charges against Trustee Chambers are very disturbing. The alleged criminal conduct that led to his arrest last week is reprehensible and inexcusable. We want our community to know that we condemn in the strongest terms this kind of behavior. It has no place in our schools or in our community.

V. REPORTING OUT OF CLOSED SESSION (Continued)

.01 CONFERENCE WITH LEGAL COUNSEL-ANTICIPATED LITIGATION PURSUANT TO GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 54956.9(b). ONE MATTER (Continued)

Mr. Chambers is entitled to due process of the law and the courts will determine his guilt or innocence. He is an elected official and until he is found guilty of committing a felony, we as an elected school board, cannot discipline or remove him from office while these charges are pending. However, we urge law enforcement, the judicial system, and Mr. Chambers to move quickly to resolve this situation and remove the unfortunate cloud his alleged conduct has placed over our school district and community.

Should Mr. Chambers be released from jail while his case is proceeding through the courts, we encourage him to refrain from any involvement with or presence at any of our campuses or school events."

Second, with regard to continuing operations of the Governing Board and District.

"As the elected members of the Buena Park School District Board of Education, we are committed to moving forward despite the negative situation involving Trustee Chambers. We have a continuing obligation to lead the school district in the best interests of our students, parents, employees, and the public. We immediately authorize Mrs. Smith to serve as presiding officer of the Board, and perform the necessary duties of President, in accordance with the Buena Park School District Board Bylaw 9123."

"In closing, let me say on behalf of my colleagues on the Board and all of the educators and staff in the district, we truly appreciate the tremendous support and understanding you have shown as we cope with this troubling situation. Our district has a lot to be proud of. Together, we will move forward and not let this terrible incident define our schools."

On June 3, 2014, the voters of the District approved Measure B, authorizing the District to issue up to \$71,000,000 in aggregate principal of bonds for authorized projects. In October 2014, under the first issuance of Measure B bonds, two series of general obligation bonds were issued. Series A bonds totaling \$19,240,000 were issued and utilized to fund long-term infrastructure and Series B bonds totaling \$1,830,000 were issued to fund short-term technology improvements.

The District is now seeking a second issuance of Measure B bonds, in an amount not to exceed \$13,000,000, to fund additional infrastructure improvements and to repay Bond Anticipation Notes (BAN) issued in May 2016 totaling \$4,165,000. The bonds will be paid from property taxes levied on property within the District levied and collected by the County of Orange. The bonds will finance projects authorized by the voters at the June 3, 2014 election.
