Subject: Summer School Plans

BACKGROUND:

In the past, Linden Unified School District had district-wide summer school coming from the same funding. This meant that we offered consistent programs throughout the district. Starting and ending times were the same and all schools were involved.

This year we have a variety of summer school programs being offered. The programs will look different at every site because they are funded from different categorical or grant monies, which means, different goals and programs for each site.

- **Extended Day** – Extended Day will be offered again this summer for students with an IEP that designates a need for summer school. This is a program that has been consistently offered every summer.
- **Migrant Summer School** - Migrant students in grades PreK-12 will be offered an opportunity to increase their core skills during summer school. This is a program that we have offered for several summers and will continue in the same format.

In addition to the two continuing programs, Extended Day and Migrant Summer School, we are introducing new summer programs at Glenwood, Linden Elementary and Waverly.

- **Glenwood** –This summer, Glenwood School is offering a summer program for Title I students in conjunction with the After School Program. Students will begin the day with math, reading, and writing as the focus to their curriculum. In the afternoon, students will experience enrichment opportunities in the areas of science and the fine arts under the direction of the ASP program. The summer program will also provide professional development opportunities for teachers as well. A reading and math coach will work with the Glenwood teachers, planning, modeling, co-teaching, and coaching as teachers develop new math and reading units that are aligned with Common Core. Glenwood will host up to 100 students, K through 4.
- **Linden Elementary** –At Linden Elementary, Title I students will have an opportunity to further develop their skills in reading, writing and math during the morning. In the afternoon, through the support of a 21st century grant, a performing and visual arts program of drama/improvisation, dance and art has been developed in addition to physical activity classes that will be offered to students. Linden Elementary will host up to 100 students, K through 4.
- **Waverly** –This program will include math, using Singapore strategies, hands on science, technology, gardening and cooking. The program will teach a variety of SPARKS, physical education games, and a sprinkling of art. This program will host several activities with the fire and sheriff's department. The culminating activity of the program will be a BBQ and field day. Waverly School will host up to 100 students in grades 3rd through 5th.
