

## Student and Parent Handbook Questionnaire

- 1) **E** - Every student succeeds  
**A** - Academic achievement & advancement  
**G** - Graduate students that are college & career ready  
**L** - Life-long learners  
**E** - Exercise high ethical standards  
**S** - Shared support of student success by family, staff and students
- 2) Student ID cards are required when checking in to the tutorial to correct work or the testing lab to complete tests, and when working out in the gym.
- 3) A student can drop a class up until the third week of instruction each semester.
- 4) Looking at someone else's paper during a test or quiz.  
Unauthorized talking with another student during a test or quiz.
- 5) Teacher makes a phone call to the parent/guardian and the parent and student are required to conference with the teacher. Teacher writes a Contract Violation and mails it home.
- 6) A missed teacher meeting will be considered as a violation of the Master Agreement Contract (Contract Violation).
- 7) Students are required to bring completed and graded assignments, their current assignment sheet, and any necessary materials/resources to their weekly teacher meeting. Students are also encouraged to bring a 3-ring binder to school with dividers, zipper-pouch with pens, pencils, a ruler, and plenty of binder paper. With these tools each student should be prepared and organized for school.
- 8) A fine will be issued for lost or damaged books.
- 9) Sunglasses, Hats, Gang Attire.
- 10) Defiance of school authority, Disruption of school activities, Profanity, Use and or possession of a controlled substance, Possession of dangerous objects.
- 11) Public transportation, bicycling, riding with friends or relatives.
- 12) Weapons, Look alike weapons, Drugs, Alcohol, Explosives.
- 13) MAP Test, 3 times a year.
- 14) Maintain your school hours.

- 17) All freshmen will take the physical fitness test.
- 18) Tutorial and Test Lab.
- 19) CHSPE or GED.
- 20) 220 units.
- 21) If a student is receiving a 65% or less in a class and/or is not on pace for course completion (independent, online, or classroom based) they will be put on an Academic Ineligibility list.
- 22) Unwelcome sexual flirtations or propositions.  
Sexual slurs, leering, epithets, threats, verbal abuse, derogatory comments or sexually degrading descriptions.
- 23) Possessing, selling or furnishing a firearm, Brandishing a knife at another person, Unlawfully selling a specified controlled substance, Committed or attempted to commit sexual assault or sexual battery, Possession of an explosive.
- 24) All students in a dance, drama, and/or choir class are required to turn in a copy of their Mid-Semester Progress Report issued by the Supervising Teacher to their VAPA instructor. Two weeks before the performance week, VAPA instructors will pass out Grade Check forms that all students in a performing arts class must take to all teachers (supervising and classroom). Teachers will list current courses and corresponding grades in all classes. If a student is receiving a grade of 65% or less in any course, the corresponding teacher has the right to require the student to attend class and/or their teacher meeting during the performance week rehearsals.
- 25) Visalia Unified School District has a 94% attendance policy that must be met during the senior year for participation in commencement ceremonies. Students must attend 94% of the periods during the senior year of high school to participate in commencement ceremonies.
