Dear Parents and Guardians:

Our number one priority has been, and always will be, offering a superior academic and spiritual education to our students that respects and reflects the investment you make to provide a Catholic education for your son. Our leading edge curriculum and innovative teaching strategies support students in performing above the national percentile in standardized tests. College acceptance is at 94% across our schools and the Class of 2017 was awarded \$319 million in college scholarships.

Our new tuition rates for the 2018-19 school year are enclosed. We never take for granted the investment you make in your child and we have worked hard to minimize these increases this year. Thanks to our school benefactors, BLOCS and the Faith in the Future Foundation, the amount of financial aid and scholarships available to help families with this cost will be increasing again this year. Families with three or more children in a diocesan high school will continue to receive discounted parental tuition, as noted on the enclosed schedule.

The first billing of the new school year will occur in June 2018 and this year we will be switching to a new tuition collection company, FACTS. You will receive information on setting up an account with FACTS in the Spring and the system will allow you to manage your account and payments online similar to the current system. All payments for the current school year should continue to be made to Smart Tuition. There is an annual fee of \$42 for a monthly payment plan, \$10 for a semi-annual payment plan, and no charge if you make your payment in full for the year. If you sign up for and make payments automatically each month, a \$110 discount will be applied to your account when your balance is paid.

The school fee of \$1,000 will be billed in the same manner as your tuition. The school fee for the 2018-19 school year includes the Chrome Book insurance fee.

Please accept my gratitude for your continued confidence in our school and the lifelong value that a Catholic education provides.
