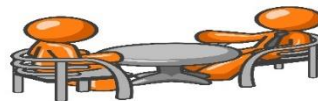

Prevent Flu: Cover Up When You Say Achoo!

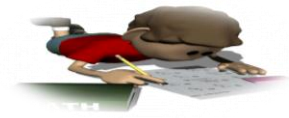
It is every mother's mantra: Cover your mouth when you cough. During flu season, it is the best advice you can give any child or adult who wants to avoid the flu.

The flu virus is passed from one person to the other through fluids from mouth and nose secretions. When we cough and sneeze, those droplets go into the air.

It is our responsibility to cover our mouth and nose so those droplets do not go into the air... so they do not spread to other people. You should sneeze into a tissue or paper towel. If you do not have those with you, you can sneeze into the crook of your elbow. Just make sure you put that clothing into the wash at night.

Keep those secretions off your hands and there is a chance it will help decrease spreading flu germs to another surfaces. Otherwise, your dirty hand will touch a doorknob or something else, then some unlucky person will touch a knob and now he or she is sick. The nasty cycle of the flu virus spreads on.
