## St. Patrick

Many people don't realize that Saint Patrick was not from Ireland. He was captured by Irish pagans and sold into slavery in Ireland. While he was there, he fell in love with the Irish people. When he escaped, he became a priest and then a bishop. He returned to Ireland to share his faith with the Irish people. In spite of the hardness of heart of the pagans, Patrick won them over little by little. In less than 30



years, he had converted the entire nation, building monasteries, churches and schools. Many legends surround the story of Saint Patrick. There are no snakes on the island of Ireland and legend has it that Saint Patrick vanquished them. This probably springs from the fact that the snake was a strong symbol in the pagan religion. The shamrock is a special symbol for devotees of Saint Patrick. As legend has it, he used the three leaf plant to explain the three in one of the Holy Trinity.
