In addition, all students must meet the minimum standard on the ISTEP+ assessment. Minimum passing scores are set by the Indiana Department of Education.

Curricular Programming

Advanced Placement: ZCHS offers 25 AP courses. Approximately 54% of the student body enrolls in one or more AP courses. Last year 49% of our students in this program scored 4 or higher on AP exams, and 81% scored 3 or higher.

Vocational Education: In conjunction with J. Everett Light Career Center, ZCHS students may take courses directly connected with a vocational interest. A majority of these courses are college preparatory level and demand a high level of technological expertise.

Special Services

Approximately 19% of ZCHS students receive special services through the Individuals with Disabilities in Education Act (IDEA) and Section 504 of the Civil Rights Act of 1973. These students excel in and out of the classroom. They also pass the statewide assessment at a higher rate than the state average for all students.

Student Activities

Zionsville Community High School offers a variety of co-curricular and extracurricular activities for students to explore their talents and interests.

Students are encouraged to aspire to be their best and have had many successes in music, academic, and athletic competition. ZCHS is a member of the IHSAA and has won state, regional team and individual competitions. Many teams and individuals have captured titles at the sectional, regional and semi-state levels and went on to complete in the IHSAA state championships. ZCHS students participate in state music competitions in vocal music, band, and orchestra. Our student publications are nationally renowned and have received the All-American award from the National Scholastic Press Association. The ZCHS yearbook and newspaper have been Pace-Maker Finalists.

Honors / Awards

ZCHS has been named a United States Department of Education-No Child Left Behind Blue Ribbon School. ZCHS has one of the highest average GQE scores in the state. Zionsville Community Schools is one of only a few school districts in Indiana to receive all A's and have all its schools be designated as "Four Star Schools". Our academic teams' successes include state and national champions. World Language students placed in the top deciles in both the statewide academic competitions and the national examinations for World Languages. ZCHS was named the 244th best high school by Newsweek magazine and the 587th most rigorous high school by the Washington Post. ZCHS is ranked 228th nationally for STEM. ZCHS is ranked the 311th best high school in the nation and the 2nd best high school in Indiana by US and World Report.
