

Parent Responsibilities

To develop responsible and self-disciplined students and a safe campus environment, these are ways parents can help:

- Review with your child the use of the Handbook/Planner, your child's teachers' course syllabi and grading system. ***Be sure last page of this Planner is signed and returned to the child's Po'okela mentor within 2 weeks.***
- Emphasize the importance of education and attending school and every class, every day, and on time.
- Call your child's counselor to schedule a conference with a teacher if you have any concerns.
- Monitor TV viewing and the use of the internet. Encourage reading.
- Occupy your child's free time with positive activities. Give them responsibilities at home.
- Get your child involved in after-school activities, sports and co-curricular activities. Support these activities by attending events in which they participate.
- Know where, with whom, and how your child is going out and when they will be home.
- Be sure your child is home at the proper time. Law states curfew hours are 10:00 pm for students ages 13, 14, and 15; and 12:00 midnight for students ages 16 & 17.
- Set limits. Reasonable boundaries make young people feel secure.
- Do not allow your child to drive without a proper license or permit.
- Reassure your child that reporting the presence of weapons or the possibility of violence on campus to school staff is not an act of disloyalty but an act of responsibility.
- Challenge your child with achievable goals.
- Help your child to improve self-image by praising effort as well as accomplishment. Emphasize the things your child does right.
- Be a good example. Your actions reflect the standards you expect. Keep your commitments.
- Make sure the school has your correct phone numbers, including work.

Student Responsibilities
