Parent concern	I/D	Mrs. Stevens will present on parent concern re bullying at Kohala Middle School. <b>Visitors at the meeting included several parents and grandparents, Kevin Cochran, School Behavior Specialist, and Celene Cook, Parent Community Network Coordinator. Mrs. Stevens and other families shared incidents that have happened to their kids in school and how it is affecting the safety and well-being of their child and the impact it has on community. Family members also expressed their frustration when the school says nothing can be done if the teacher/adult did not see it happen. Other concerns brought up were inadequate lunches and time to eat and the language and words being used by some of the adults on campus. Some solutions brought up were: (1) more school and grade-level bonding activities, (2) more volunteer adult supervision in school/at recess, (3) lowering of teacher threshold, (4) grants/funding for more security, (5) setting up common school/class routines, (6) teacher/student respect will bring about student/student respect, (7) creating connections between teachers/students and student/students, (8) students being heard and validated when reporting incidents. It was suggested the continuation of these parent/community concerns and future issues be discussed within a Parent Community Network committee, headed by the PCNC, and problems and recommendations for solutions be brought to the SCC monthly meetings.</b>	Mrs. Stevens	<b>15 Min</b>
