NEW BUSINESS: Candy Biehle gave presentation regarding Brown Primary participating in the Fuel up of 60 Kick off. Dairy cow Elsie present with mustache contest and pictures taken. Mrs. Biehle also commented on possible grant information being granted for Brown Primary to instill garden. More information to follow in regards to grant received or denied. During the event six stations were set up including yogurt, mustache pictures, fruit and vegetable to taste, and Chef from Region13 who performed cooking demo. Currently Mrs. Biehle working on getting fuel up to play 60 for Junior High and High School campuses.

Mrs. Biehle and Anna Murray spoke about the plan in place to reuse fruit and milk products taken by students but not used. Students are required to take a milk and fruit product and it was noticed that a great deal of these products were then placed in garbage receptacles. After speaking with the Health Department with a stamp of approval for redistribution of these products, these products are placed in cool containers for redistribution. These products are allowed for students to take home.

Mrs. Biehle stated she now serves a great deal of fresh fruit in the cafeteria but with the rising cost of fruit it may be necessary to offer canned fruits in place of fresh fruit.

Judy Bergeron expressed thank you for the new updated web site to include the information of about scoliosis and medical health events to Smithville parents.

Lynn Ponsonby and Johnnie Hernandez were present from the Health Department in Temple to speak about the new TVFC guidelines regarding

immunizations. They also spoke about the new recommendations regarding immunizations.

Dr. Neal Spears spoke about the incidence of both Flu A and Flu B. New vaccine next year will be quadrivalent vaccine to include two types of A and B strains thus offering better protection. Dr. Spears also spoke in regards to a few cases of Lyme disease and mumps being seen in the area.
