

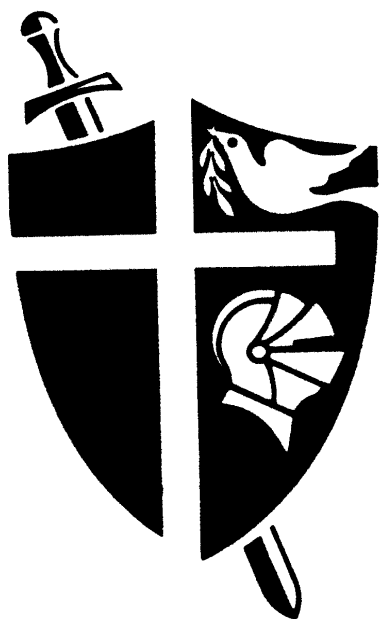

WHO MAY ATTEND?

- ◆ Enrollment is co-ed and is open to students entering 7th through 12th grades (exceptions are noted).
- ◆ Students from other high schools should verify the transfer credit guidelines with their guidance counselors PRIOR to enrolling in a course at St. Francis High School.
- ◆ Students from other high schools must provide a signature from their school administration verifying they are in good standing with their school.
- ◆ Each class requires a minimum enrollment of 10 students.
- ◆ Students may enroll in up to four (4) courses.
- ◆ Enrollment is on a first-come, first-serve basis.

PAYMENTS

- ◆ Payment in full is due at the time of registration.
- ◆ A \$25.00 late fee will be assessed on applications received after June 10.
- ◆ Registration for all Camps is SEPARATE.
- ◆ Please write SEPARATE checks for any of the Camps. Designate "Advanced Baseball", "HS Baseball", "Basketball", "Drumline", "Fr. Football", "JV Football", "Varsity Football", "Lacrosse", "Soccer", "Track", or "Volleyball", Camp.

REFUNDS

- ◆ If a student withdraws in the first week, written notification from the parent is required. There is a 50% refund.
- ◆ No refunds will be given after the first week of classes.
- ◆ A full refund of tuition will be given for any class which is canceled due to insufficient enrollment.

SUMMER SCHOOL POLICIES

ATTENDANCE

- ◆ Students are expected to attend every class.
- ◆ Students who miss more than five (5) hours of instruction may not receive credit. Petitions for students to miss more than 5 hours must be filed with the Summer Session Director no later than June 9.
- ◆ A parent must report an absence as early as possible each day by calling (818) 790-0325. A student must bring a note on the day he/she returns.
- ◆ Excessive Absences or failure to clear an absence may result in dismissal with no refund.
- ◆ St. Francis maintains a closed campus. Students may not leave campus between classes.

DRESS CODE

- ◆ Dress is casual in summer.
- ◆ Students may wear shorts, casual pants and t-shirts.
- ◆ Cut-off shorts or shirts, tank tops, inappropriate t-shirt insignia, thongs/sandals, gang-style or sloppy clothing are **NOT** acceptable. A student's mid-section **MUST** be covered.

JUNIOR HIGH PROGRAM

*The **JUNIOR HIGH PROGRAM** is offered for Pass / Fail Credit only. It is an enrichment program that improves the skills of students in essential academic areas. Entering 7th or 8th graders who want to improve their skills in a non-graded environment will benefit from our program.*

ENGLISH REVIEW # JH1

This course is a summary of basic junior high English concepts, including grammar and writing, with emphasis on the individual needs of each student.

Periods 1, 2, or 3

Tuition: \$300

MATH REVIEW # JH2

This course is a preparation in basic junior high math including fractions, percentages, and decimals, with emphasis on the individual needs of each student.

Period 3

Tuition: \$300

PRE ALGEBRA # JH3

This course is a review of basic mathematical principles with an emphasis on the algebraic principles necessary for success in Algebra 1. Recommended for 8th graders with strong math skills.

Periods 1 or 2

Tuition: \$300

STUDY SKILLS FOR SUCCESS # JH4

In this course the student will learn organization, note-taking techniques, test-taking strategies, and the tools for effective listening.

Periods 1 or 2

Tuition: \$300

HSPT MATH # JH7

Teaching and reviewing basic math concepts covered by the High School Entrance Exam and includes test-taking strategies and exposure to test questions.

Period 4

Tuition: \$300

PRE SPANISH # F5

This is an introductory course for those who have never taken Spanish. Open to 7th, 8th and 9th graders.

IPAD SKILLS # F4

Students will be introduced to navigating the iPad including educational apps, calendar, keynote, numbers, camera, and video. Students will also receive an overview on how these devices are used at St. Francis to take quizzes and submit homework. Students will use St. Francis iPads in class.

JUNIOR HIGH PROGRAM

PHYSICAL EDUCATION #F6

This course guides students to run, to participate in field events, to lift weights, and to get in shape. Here is a great opportunity to get acquainted with their athletic abilities. Emphasis will be placed on developing physical confidence and stamina. Open to 7th - 12th graders.

Tuition: \$300

STRENGTH/CONDITIONING # F7

Open to 6th, 7th, 8th graders, this course will focus on flexibility, speed mechanics, coordination, and injury prevention. Students will learn how to lift weights with appropriate technique and learn the appropriate strength techniques for specific sports. Supervised by the St. Francis Strength and Conditioning Coach.

Periods 2 or 3

Tuition: \$300

LEADERSHIP

F9

This course is designed to help students enhance their leadership skills. The class will focus on 10 areas, of leadership development: Vision, Integrity, Innovativeness, Wise Judgment, Service Mindedness, Goal Processing, Skill Assessment, Emotional Maturity, Fostering Relationships and Masterful Communication. The class will include leadership concepts, ideas and activities, and challenge the students engage their positive leadership more passionately and purposefully.

Period s3 or 4

Tuition: \$300

CSI: FORENSIC SCIENCE

Become a crime scene investigator! This course is designed to give students hands-on experience in the science lab solving realistic crime scene scenarios using actual forensic techniques. Activities will include: forensic photography, glass fragment analysis, analyses of blood and skeletal remains, identifying trace substances, developing latent fingerprints, identifying forgeries, forensic entomology, DNA fingerprinting, and ballistics. The course will culminate in a "Who done it" mock trial using student analyses of evidence gathered from a simulated crime scene.

ENTERING FRESHMAN PROGRAM

*The **ENTERING FRESHMAN PROGRAM** is designed to help 9th graders prepare for success in high school. Class size is limited to twenty-five (25) students, and preference in enrollment is given to St. Francis students.*

PRE-ALGEBRA # F1 **(MATH Requirement)**

This course is a review of basic mathematical principles needed for success in Algebra 1, including a review of fractions, decimals, basic computation, and percentages.

Periods 1, 3, or 4
Tuition: \$300

STUDY SKILLS/ READING IMPROVEMENT # F2 **(READING Requirement)**

This course will assist students in goal-setting, note-taking, and test strategies, and prepare students to improve their reading comprehension. St. Francis Summer Reading books will be used.

Periods 1, 2, 3, or 4
Tuition: \$300

WRITING FUNDAMENTALS # F3 **(LANGUAGE Requirement)**

Designed for students who require assistance in Language Fundamentals, this course will summarize grammatical concepts and assist students in developing their composition skills.

Tuition: \$300

IPAD SKILLS # F4

Quarter Students will be introduced to navigating the iPad including educational apps, calendar, keynote, numbers, camera, and video. PRE-SPANISH # F5

It will include lessons in power/hang cleans, bench press, back squats, plyometrics, core strength and circuit training.

OPEN TO ALL GRADE LEVELS 6-12

INTRODUCTION TO GUITAR

#T4

This class is designed for students seeking to understand the fundamentals of guitar, including tuning, finger picking, chords, and strumming. By the end of the class, students will have an understanding of these elements and will have sufficient understanding to read basic musical charts by sight. The class will be limited to 15 students. Each student must bring an acoustic guitar (steel or nylon string) to class each day.

DRUMLINE CAMP June 19 - July 19

This is an introduction to the different aspects of a drumline. Students will learn to read music, practice their development of cadence and be instructed in precision marching as well as other performance facets of Drumline. Recommended for returning drumline performers, the camp is also open to beginners. Instruments are provided.

INTRODUCTION TO THE ARTS B; 1 SEMESTER (5 CREDITS) for rising juniors and seniors

This course is a continuation of Introduction to the Arts A, the sophomore-year course that focuses on theater/drama. Together, Introduction to the Arts A and B satisfy the University of California/California State University yearlong visual and performing arts requirement.

Introduction to the Arts B will focus on the visual arts. This course will provide students with an appreciation for the visual arts by providing them with an overview of art history, an understanding of a variety of artistic mediums, opportunities to visit Art Museums, listen to professional artists, guest speakers, and the study of film as artistic expression. The class will meet from 8:00 a.m. until 12:55 p.m. from June 20 to July 6

COLLEGE BOOT CAMP FOR RISING SENIORS (2018) #W2

**PLEASE NOTE SPECIAL DATES
(ONE WEEK SEMINAR June 5 - 8)**

College boot camp will give students a jump start on the college admissions process. We will discuss how to utilize resources such as Naviance, Collegeboard, Fiske Guide, etc. Students will spend time on various types of college applications (UC/CSU/Common Application) and discuss the different types of application deadlines (EA/ED/Priority/ Regular). They will begin their personal statement/insight questions, participate in mock interviews and hear from guest speakers. They will learn about various types of financial aid and the process of applying for financial aid. By the end of the program students will have prepared a resume, complete at least one "Request for Teacher Letter of Recommendation" form, completed their College Planning Survey, and created a working College list.
