

Bon Lin Procedures:

Students are expected to turn in original work for all school assignments. Cheating is defined as follows:

1. Plagiarism (includes copying information from the internet and passing it off as original work)
2. Giving or attempting to give test information
3. Receiving or attempting to receive test information
4. Giving or attempting to give work to others
5. Receiving or attempting to receive work from others
6. Taking credit for another's ideas
7. Taking credit for another's work
8. Using materials, including calculators, without permission from the teacher to aid in completing assignments.

First Offense: Student receives a Minor per PBIS discipline procedures and receives appropriate consequence such as silent lunch or grade level detention, teacher notifies the parent, & student completes an alternative assignment.

Second Offense: Teacher turns in a Major on the student to Administration, per PBIS discipline procedures. Student issued 1 day of ISS for cheating. Student must complete an alternative assignment.

Third Offense: Teacher turns in a Major on the student to Administration, per PBIS discipline procedures. Student is issued 3 days of ISS for cheating. Student receives a ZERO for the assignment.

Continuing Offenses: Teacher turns in a Major on the student to Administration, per PBIS discipline procedures. Student is issued Out of School Suspension & student receives a ZERO for the assignment.
