SSC Meeting Minutes

Date: March 27, 2018

- I. Call the Meeting to Order by Felix Berkin at 3:20pm**

- VII. New Business: Legal Requirements:**
 - a. Dr. Salehi shared the new total funding for 2017-2018 Final Title I Allocation According to ConApp for Los Alisos Middle School is \$366,821 which Includes the Parent Involvement Centralized Services. He stated most likely we will use all of that money on technology (including Chrome Books and Apple TVs), instruments, PLTW, parent involvement, and staff development. Felix questioned if teachers who don't have an Apple TV will get them. Dr. Salehi stated that that is the goal and we will try to get TVs for all teachers who need them.
 - b. Dr. Salehi shared the School Dashboard Data including scores and data. There are 2 overall areas and 4 levels in English Language Arts and Math. For each grade level the Achievement Level Scale Score Range goes up, unlike the CST where the level was consistent. The Dashboard includes attendance, English Language Arts and Math, ELLs, suspensions. He reviewed that we are in the orange area for all sections except EL progress. Felix asked if this was for this year and Dr. Salehi informed him these are the results from last year (2017). In the past, schools tried to push the students who were close to "Standard Met," but the SBAC measures all students and averages them out. Dr. Salehi shared that math scores are low statewide because the emphasis used to be on procedures and memorization of formulas. The current test measures if that you know how to make a mathematical problem to solve it and then solve it. It is based on 21st Century Skills such as communication, analytics, collaboration, problem solve, and creativity. Dr. Salehi shared the last 3 years of EL students making progress. Last year was 84.9%. It was measured in the past by the CELDT and this year will be the ELPAC testing. Paula Mayes shared that one reason may be AVID Excel classes that are in place. Dr. Salehi shared that students who are reclassified do better than EO students after they learn the language.

There are some things we have done district-wide, Dr. Salehi shared, such as the UCI Language Arts training in 6th grade and the Math coach that met with the teachers to support the Math Campaign.

VIII. Reports:

- a. ELAC/DELAC- Dr. Salehi shared there was a large turn out. He shared the school safety plan for our school and district.
- b. AVID- We are sending 11 teachers to summer institute in Anaheim to get trained. We are expanding our AVID program from 2 sections to 6 sections. We will continue to have our 2 AVID Excel classes. We are moving to our goal of being AVID school-wide. Felix stated it looks good for our school when we expand the program and helps to recruit students. 95% of students in AVID programs go to 4 year colleges. Mrs. Yarbrough asked if we are looking to have students able to have more options to attend 2 electives. Dr. Salehi shared if we have the numbers we will have 2 zero period PEs.
- c. Magnet- We are expanding 2 classes in 8th grade as well: App Creators and Green Architecture.
- d. Spanish- We are also offering 6th grade Spanish next year and expand it to 7th and 8th grade in the future. Students who complete our program will take Spanish 2 or 3 in high school which opens up opportunities to take AP Spanish in high school.
