School Profile 2016-17

Established in 2009, Del Norte High School is a comprehensive public high school in grades 9-12 and is fully accredited by the Schools Commission of the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC). Recognized as a 2013 California Distinguished School, DNHS is the fifth and most recent comprehensive high school to be opened in the Poway Unified School District. Our state-of-the-art campus is located in the newly established suburban communities of 4S Ranch and Del Sur. While Del Norte offers many of the same courses as other Poway Unified high schools, it is unique with its combination of the trimester schedule, the veteran faculty and the sophisticated facility. The school's design has taken into account the rapid transformation of technology and is equipped to respond to new mediums of communication as they emerge. In a district with a population of almost 33,000 K-12 students, Del Norte currently serves 2,077 students with a senior class of 493 students.

THE CURRICULUM

The Del Norte curriculum is an academically challenging college preparatory program. Under Del Norte's trimester schedule, students may take up to five 5-credit classes each 12-week term, enabling them to earn up to 75 credits in one year.

Each 5-credit trimester course is equivalent to a 5-credit semester course.

Graduation requirements: Students must complete a minimum of 230 credits that include the following requirements:

Exercise and Nutritional Science (ENS) 1-2 earns 5 credits of Health and 5 credits of PE. ENS 3 earns 5 credits of PE.

Classes identified as college preparatory are coded "P", Honors classes are coded "H", and Advanced Placement are coded "AH." Advanced Placement classes are graded on a 5.0-point scale. AP Seminar classes are electives graded on a 4.0 scale.

ELECTIVE COURSES

Courses are offered in Applied Arts and Technology (3D Animation, Intro to Engineering Design, Web Design); Performing Arts (Band, Choir, Drama, Orchestra, Wind Ensemble); Visual Art (Design Mixed Media, Digital Media Productions, Drawing & Painting, Ceramics, Photography); and school service (academic tutors and vocational learning assistant).

REGIONAL OCCUPATIONAL PROGRAM (ROP)

ROP supports the Career Technical Education (CTE) courses: 3D Computer Animation, Web Design, Marketing Economics, Intro to Engineering Design, Principles of Biomedical Science, Human Body Systems, Photography, and Work Experience.

FACULTY

Del Norte High School's teacher: pupil ratio is 1: 35.5. Our faculty consists of 78 teachers, 4 administrators, 4.5 counselors, 1 school psychologist, 1 speech pathologist, 1 librarian and 60 classified staff members.

SPECIAL EDUCATION

Special instruction is provided for students with active Individualized Education Plans (IEP). Del Norte High School offers a full continuum of services for students with mild to moderate and moderate to severe disabilities. In accordance with I.D.E.A. (Individuals with Disabilities in Education Act), our call is to educate all of our students in the least restrictive environment. In support of this, our site offers collaborative instruction within the general education environment for our students with IEP's as well as in house L/content classes. Additionally, we have two mod/severe classes in a Critical Skills (CS) and an Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) class. In our RSP support class, we support academic needs, organizational needs, and provide transition planning.

EXTRA CURRICULAR OPPORTUNITIES

Del Norte Athletics offers 23 sports in which students can participate. We have won 50 league titles since 2010 and won 7 CIF titles since the school opened in the fall of 2009. Over the last 7 years, approximately 60% of Del Norte's student body participated in athletics. We encourage all students to get involved in our diverse programs; there is a sport for everybody.

Del Norte also provides exposure to a wide range of communities including Anime, Band, Color Guard, Ecofuture, award-winning Debate Club, Key Club, Robotics, Rugby and Science Olympiad, and many more. There are currently 74 clubs for Del Norte students to improve their knowledge/skills and bring community awareness.
