<a href="#">The Gates Scholarship</a>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>High school senior</li> <li>From at least one of the following ethnicities: African-American, American Indian/Alaska Native, Asian &amp; Pacific Islander American, and/or Hispanic American</li> <li>Pell-eligible</li> <li>A US Citizen, national or permanent resident</li> <li>A minimum cumulative weighted GPA of 3.3 on a 4.0 scale</li> <li>Student must plan to enroll full-time, in a four-year degree program, at a US accredited, not-for-profit, private or public college or university</li> </ul>	<b>September 15, 2017</b>
<a href="#">2017 QuestBridge National College Match</a>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The QuestBridge National College Match is open to all:</li> <li>U.S. Citizens and Permanent Residents <b>OR</b></li> <li>Students, regardless of citizenship, currently attending high school in the United States.</li> <li>Primarily A's in the most challenging courses available (usually including Honors, AP, and/or IB level courses.)</li> <li>Top 5-10% of your graduating class.</li> <li>SAT or PSAT scores &gt; 1310</li> <li>ACT composite score &gt; 28</li> <li>Finalists typically come from households earning less than \$65,000 annually for a family of four</li> </ul>	<b>September 27, 2017</b>
<a href="#">Dr. Pepper Tuition Giveaway</a>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Must be a U.S. legal resident</li> <li>Must be 18-24 years old by 12/2/17</li> </ul>	<b>October 18, 2017 11:59am PT</b>
<a href="#">Horatio Alger Association</a>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Be enrolled full time as a high school senior in the United States; be progressing normally toward graduation in spring/summer of 2018 with plans to enter a college in the United States no later than the Fall following graduation</li> <li>Exhibit a strong commitment to pursue and complete a bachelor's degree at an accredited non-profit public or private institution in the United States (students may start their studies at a two-year institution and then transfer to a four-year institution)</li> <li>Demonstrate critical financial need (\$55,000 or lower adjusted gross family income is required)</li> <li>Be involved in co-curricular and community service</li> </ul>	<b>October 25, 2017 by 3:00pm</b>
