



Wilson Elementary School

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School Profile

Woodrow Wilson Elementary School has an enrollment of approximately 770 students from preschool through sixth grade. We have 8 Special Education Classes servicing approximately 110 students. Our Resource Specialist Program services approximately 35 students, the Speech Program services approximately 90 students, and the Adaptive Physical Education Program services approximately 5 students. The population of Wilson is 96.2% Hispanic or Latino, 3.1% African-American, 0.01% Cambodian, 0.01% American Indian, 0.01% Asian Indian and 0.02% Samoan. All students with a second language in the home, as indicated by the home language survey, receive testing in both English and their native language. Our language assessment information finds that we have approximately 350 English Learners and 135 Fluent English Proficient students. The remainder of the population is classified as English Only.

The socio-economic status of Wilson is based on information obtained from the lunch application. Parents are given a free-lunch application upon enrollment. Since more than 76% of our students qualify for free lunch, the school receives school-wide free lunch.

Wilson currently has 44 certificated and 34 classified employees.

Currently, Wilson teachers are implementing the District-wide 50/50 Instructional Plan. Teachers attended training in curriculum alignment and curriculum implementation. Grade levels collaborated to build targeted standards matrices and unit assessments.

During the summer, teachers, the instructional lead, the RSP teacher, and the administrator attended a week long training to implement the 50/50 instructional plan, ALD/ELD differentiated instruction rotations, and whole group math with manipulatives.

Last school year, all students participated in the Smarter Balance Assessment Consortium (SBAC) English Language Arts (ELA) and Math Assessments. Students also participated in district-wide internal "Common" benchmark assessments.
