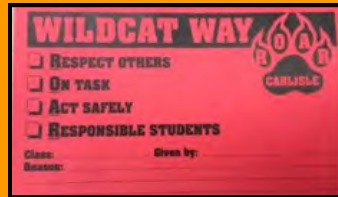

Spotlight on Carlisle Elementary It's Raining Red and Gold!



Students and classes are earning positive reinforcement tickets at Carlisle Elementary for being respectful, responsible, and ready to learn. Staff members at Carlisle

Elementary have worked together to develop a Positive Behavior Intervention and Support (PBIS) Plan. PBIS is defined as a philosophy and practice of recognizing the importance of positive relationships among all members of a school community for the purpose of enhancing learning.

- ⇒ PBIS emphasizes prevention, active instruction, and evidence-based practices.
- ⇒ When a child misbehaves, we view the problem as a skill deficit in the same manner that we would view problems in academic areas.
- ⇒ The goal is to build effective environments in which positive behavior is reinforced so that academic success can be achieved.
- ⇒ Social and behavioral expectations need to be defined and taught. PBIS uses data to guide decisions regarding change.

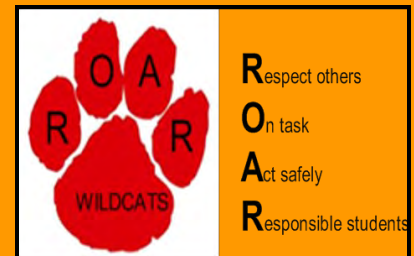


The students have been explicitly taught the PBIS expectations in each of the common areas in the school and their classrooms. In addition to the initial teaching, the students will have re-teachings in January and March.



Expectations posters are displayed around the building and in the buses to continually promote positive behavior. All of the Carlisle staff will be teaching their students the positive behaviors they are expected to demonstrate at school. We will acknowledge and reward individuals/ classes who consistently demonstrate these positive behaviors. The school will be collecting Box Tops for Education to raise money for the PBIS fund so that incentives can be purchased for the students.

All staff members are provided “yellow tickets” to distribute to any students who are demonstrating appropriate behaviors that follow the school-wide expectations. The yellow tickets can be used to earn a variety of classroom and individual rewards. Each student keeps track of yellow tickets earned on their individual punch card. Once a punch card is full, the student can purchase rewards or extra privileges. Students may choose various rewards including tangible items from the reward cart; eating lunch with a staff member; bringing in stuffed animals; reading morning announcements over the loudspeaker; sitting in Mr. Allison’s Batman chair for a day; etc.



All staff members also have “red tickets” to distribute to entire classes that are demonstrating appropriate behaviors. Once a class earns ten red tickets, they can choose a whole class reward. We will also have an all-school assembly on November 21 to kick off our new theme: *Be the reason someone smiles today*. We can all do this by using kind words; helping people; and doing the right thing.

Working together to promote positive behavior helps increase student achievement and gets our students ready for the 21st Century Learning Skills. Research shows that when the home and school work together, student learning is more successful. We look forward to an exciting school year full of new learning.

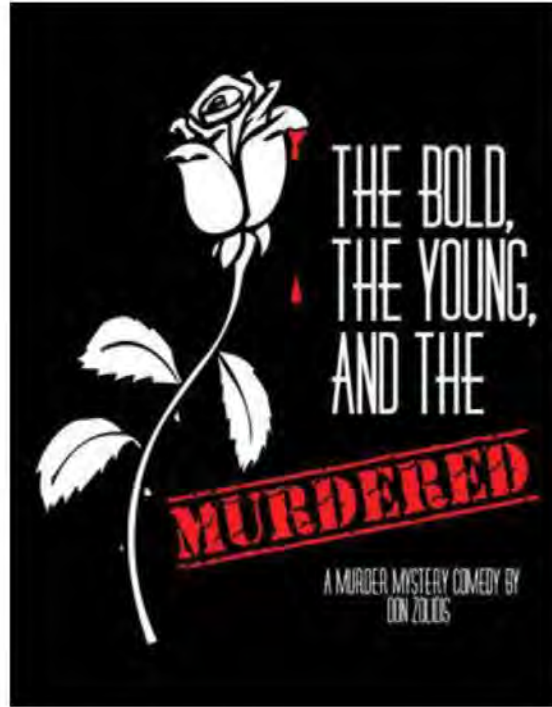

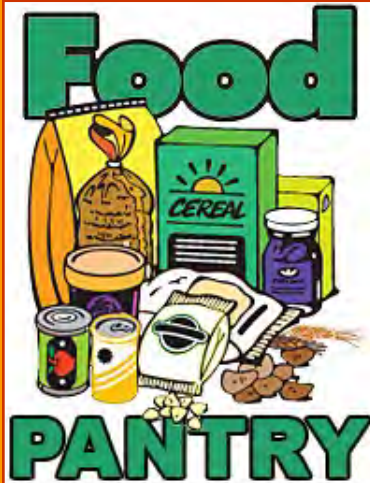

Just a reminder the Carlisle Schools Food Pantry is open to the public on the 1st and 3rd Thursdays of the month from 4:00 p.m.—6:00 p.m. at the West entrance of the High School building in Room 106.
