





## Welcome to the A. Philip Randolph Campus High School.

A. Philip Randolph Campus High School (APRCHS) offers students a college preparatory experience within the context of a supportive learning community. Randolph students apply for membership in one of three academies: the Medical Academy, the Engineering Academy, and the Humanities Academy. Each academy grants member students the opportunity to engage in special coursework and events that will prepare them for admission to competitive colleges and universities within their chosen fields. Our location on The City College of New York (CCNY) campus affords students an opportunity to attend college courses, seminars, and special events that serve to enrich their high school experience. Qualified students have the opportunity to earn college credits from CCNY and Touro College at no cost while enrolled in High School.



### The Academy of Engineering: The Academy of Engineering offers students the opportunity to explore careers in Engineering.

Students enrolled in the Academy of Engineering take courses designed by Project Lead the Way (PLTW), the leading provider of rigorous and innovative Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) education curricular programs in middle and high school across the United States. Students enrolled in the Academy of Engineering are also offered the opportunity to apply for membership in the National Society for Black Engineers (NSBE) which is an equal opportunity honors organization supported by CCNY. Students are also encouraged to participate in our Robotics team which took the Top Rookie Seed Award in 2012

### The Academy of Medicine: The Academy of Medicine offers students the opportunity to explore careers in the health professions.

Students enrolled in the Academy of Medicine take courses such as Introduction to Health Careers, Anatomy and Physiology, Advanced Placement Biology or Psychology, and Science Research Methodology.



Students enrolled in the Academy of Medicine are also offered the opportunity to apply for membership in the prestigious Gateway to Medicine honors program through CCNY which offers several exclusive scholarship and enrichment experiences. Students in the Gateway program are also offered exclusive enrichment opportunities with the Sophie Davis School of Medicine located within CCNY.

### The Academy of the Humanities: The Academy of the Humanities offers students the opportunity to explore the liberal arts as they prepare for entry to a competitive college or university. Students enrolled in the Academy of the Humanities take courses such as Introduction to the Humanities, Research Methodology, The Language of Argument, and Film as Literature.

Students enrolled in the Academy of the Humanities are also encouraged to participate in additional enrichment courses such as AP US History, AP English Composition, and AP English Literature. Students in the Academy of the Humanities are invited to exclusive events with CCNY, Harlem Stage, and other cultural organizations with the NYC area.



APRCHS is also proud to offer a comprehensive Dual Language Program. A Dual Language Program serves English Language Learner (ELL) students by placing them in an immersive environment in which they will be exposed to both Spanish and English language instruction in the following subject areas: History, English Language Arts, Science, and Mathematics.

This program is equally exciting to non-ELL students as it also allows students who are proficient in English and Spanish the opportunity to participate in the program and further develop their Spanish speaking and writing skills to include the ability to discourse in academic language as well as conversational speech. These students will be selected from incoming 9<sup>th</sup> graders who are identified as having advanced Spanish speaking abilities. The program places 17 Spanish speaking students with limited English ability in a classroom with 17 English speaking/Spanish proficient students. This will allow both groups of students the ability to acquire new skills while being in a supportive environment.

Another key feature of the program is the marriage of the English Language Arts (ELA) class and the Native Language Arts (NLA) class. The NLA class teaches the same reading and writing skills that students experience in the ELA class but conducts the class using Spanish language and texts. During the double period class both the ELL and non-ELL students will be exposed to ELA and NLA aligned instruction which will best prepare all of the students to meet the Common Core State Standards.

**Extra-Curricular Activities:** All APRCHS students are encouraged to participate in our full range of after school activities and clubs. APRCHS offers a wide range of PSAL sports (24) which include Football, Cheerleading, Varsity Boys and Girls Basketball, Baseball, Softball, Lacrosse, Swimming, Track and Field, Boys and Girls Soccer, Wrestling, and many more. Students are also encouraged to participate in our college preparatory organizations such as the College and Career Preparatory Institute (CCPI), National Honor's Society, Gateway, and NSBE. Students are also encouraged to participate in student government which plan events throughout the year.
