Got a Job?

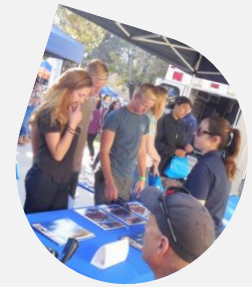
All students who want to work while in high school must have a Work Permit. From the age of 14, students may begin working limited hours during their high school career. Students must maintain a minimum of a 2.0 GPA and good attendance.

Work Permit Process:

- 1) Find a job.
- 2) Request a work permit application and fill it out.
- 3) Turn it in to Mrs. Pearce or Mrs. Hilton.
- 4) You will receive the Work Permit.
- 5) Turn it in to your employer.
- 6) Maintain 2.0 GPA and good attendance to keep your permit active
